Syracuse '11'
Leads Offense

NEW YORK (AP)—Rolling up
a total of 369 yards, including 155
by rushing, against West Virginia
unbeaten Syracuse not only set
two single game records, but dis-
placed North Texas State as the
No. 1 offensive college football
team of the nation.

NCAA Service Bureau statistics
released today also reveal
Syracuse has increased its lead
in scoring, and now has a five-
game average of 36.4 points to
31.5 for second-place Mississippi.

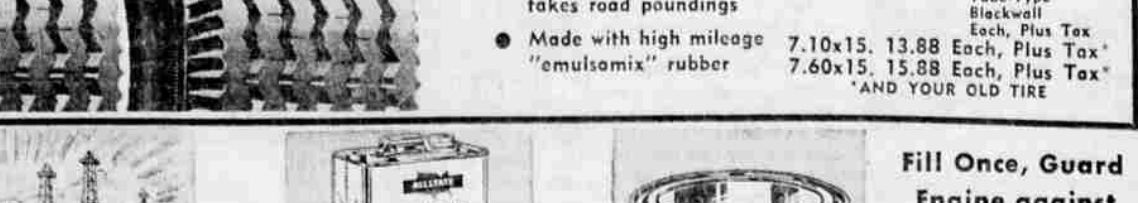
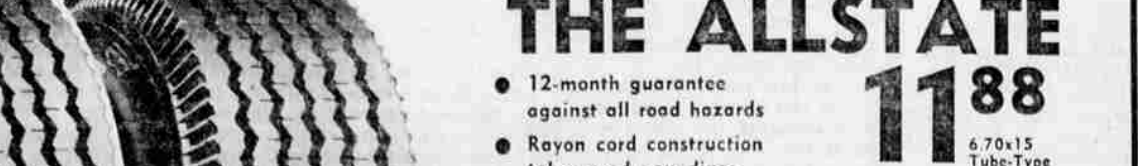
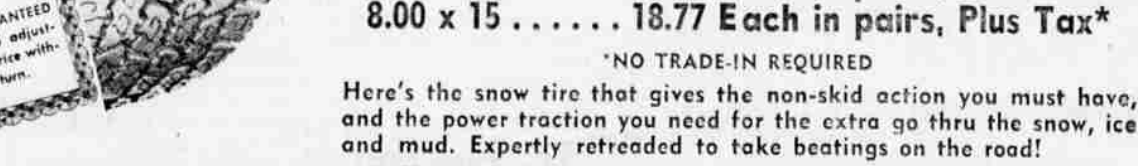
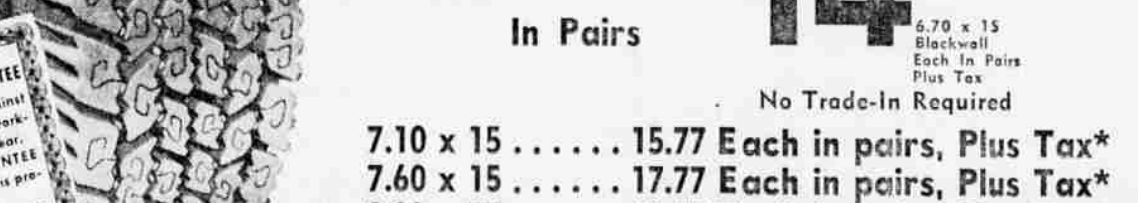
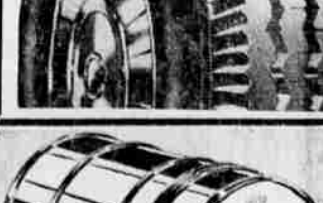
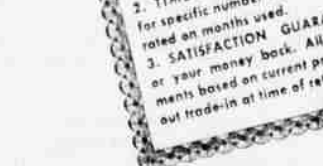
Yankee Slugger
Trade Possible

DALLAS (AP)—Mickey Mantle,
star slugger of the New York
Yankees, said Tuesday night he
wouldn't be surprised if he got
traded off this winter.

"I'm not kidding," Mantle said
in an interview. "I think they
would trade anyone to help the
team."

He said he didn't know whether
he was on the trading block, but
added, "the way things went this
season I certainly think any play-
er could be traded and I'm one
of the players."

But, he said, he expects the
Yankees to win the pennant in
1960.

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
