

Lawyer Asks Will Transfer

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Attorney Melvin Belli said Wednesday he would seek to have court jurisdiction over Errol Flynn's will transferred from New York to California.

Belli, acting as the attorney for the late actor's 17-year-old girl friend, Beverly Aadland, said his move would be one of three actions designed to force recognition of a 1957 will by Flynn leaving one third of his estate to Miss Aadland.

He declined to say what the other two legal maneuvers would be, adding that Flynn's New York attorney, Justin Goldenbock, would find out through summons or other services.

Belli said he felt the matter presently was being handled in New York courts only because Goldenbock lived there. The residence of an attorney in a given state does not qualify it as the place of jurisdiction, he said.

Flynn made his home alternately in Hollywood and Jamaica. He died Oct. 1 in Vancouver, B.C., where he had gone on a business deal.

A will drawn in 1954 and filed in New York last week left the bulk of Flynn's estate to his widow, Patrice Wymore.

But on Monday an unsigned will dated 1957 was filed in New York, favoring Miss Aadland.

Belli said the unsigned will was only one of three wills Miss Aadland wrote at Flynn's dictation. He said two of the wills were left unsigned because they were marred by her spelling errors. But the third will, substantially the same as the other two, was signed and left her one-third of Flynn's estate.

Flying Saucer Test Slated

WASHINGTON (UPI)—America is about to test fly its first flying saucer.

But the hush-hush project is about four months behind schedule according to a timetable made available to United Press International earlier this year.

Even so, this country is hoping to beat the Russians to the punch in developing the radical new aircraft, which the Soviets also are assumed to be working on.

The latest word on the saucer came from Toronto Wednesday after a free-lance photographer flew over its hangar and took a picture of the shining craft parked outside.

The incident caused red faces but prompted Sir Roy Dobson, board chairman of Avro Aircraft Ltd. of Canada, which is developing the saucer for the United States, to disclose that the first outside test flight will be made soon.

Dobson said the 30-foot diameter saucer already had made a successful flight inside a hangar, rising under its own power, on a cushion of air jetted from beneath the craft.

Walter B. Smith Critically Ill

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gen. Walter Bedell Smith is in critical condition in Walter Reed Army Hospital.

Smith was President Eisenhower's chief of staff in World War II. He later served as director of the Central Intelligence Agency, undersecretary of state and ambassador to the Soviet Union.

Smith, 64, is suffering from pneumonia and a lung abscess.

PRINCESS OPENS SCHOOL, LONDON (UPI)—Princess Margaret said Wednesday that scientific achievements will never replace spiritual faith as the means of helping man over his problems.

"It is no good for man to seek escape in Luniks and rocketry and to leave his soul morally earthbound among the television sets and espresso bars," she said in a speech opening a church school.

Defense Chief Warns Nation

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Defense Secretary Neil McElroy said Wednesday night he believes Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev was acting in good faith when he declared military conflict between the U.S. and the U.S.S.R. to be outmoded.

But McElroy warned that the Communists have not altered their strategic objectives.

Any shift in Red tactics to peaceful means of competition would take place because military conflict "involves too high a price," he told a \$100-a-plate Republican dinner.

He said both sides in the East-West struggle want to keep the competition within safe bounds.

Speaking of his recent tour of the Far East, the defense chief said he became "more and more convinced of the interdependence of countries of the allied free world." He said countries like

South Korea, Nationalist China and Laos could not survive without American help.

"Nor could we long endure without their continued existence," he added.

McElroy said the key to collective security was the "hard core of United States retaliatory power, despite evidence that the Communist leaders of the Soviet Union may be changing their tactics in such a way that peace—defined as the absence of major military conflict—is probable."

About 1,300 persons attended the dinner.

Grocery Chain Denies Charge

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Safeway, Slender-Way bread is slenderizing. Stores Inc., one of the nation's major supermarket chains, stood firm today on claims that its bread has fewer calories than a slice of ordinary bread because Slender-Way bread is sliced thinner.

The company made the statement in reply to Sept. 16 charges by the Federal Trade Commission that it was falsely claiming weight reducing qualities for the bread.

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
