Car Mishap Figures Told

CHICAGO (AP)—Traffic accidents in the United States killed 3,330 persons last month and 27,140 in the first nine months of this year, the National Safety Council reports.

The September toll was the same as in September 1958, the council said, and the nine-month toll was 870 more than for the same period last year.

"It isn't much to shout about," the council said, "but at least it's better than the unbroken increases that prevailed during the first seven months of the year."
