Approximately 300 carpenters walked out Thursday and union officials said more than 3,000 would be affected if the strike spread. Another 3,000 Associated craftsmen working on millions of dollars worth of projects would also be affected.

Contractors involved in the dispute are responsible for most of the commercial and highway building in the four counties. Home construction was not hit by Thursday's walkout.
