Ruth Russell, junior librarian, read a book report, "Friends Among Strangers" by Eleanor Jewell, which was entertainment for the evening.

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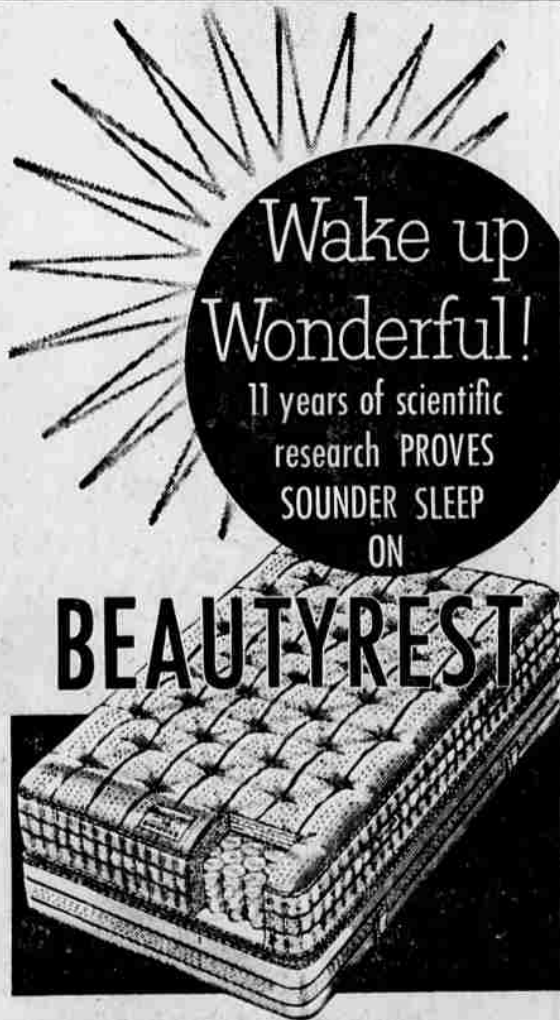
