A \$300,000 building program is scheduled by Great Northern Railway Co. for Klamath Falls, according to Paul Cruikshank, superintendent, Klamath division. . . the project will include making some tracks longer so GN can handle longer trains and the addition of five new tracks. . . also, a new motor car shop to cost \$25,000 will be built near the present yard office in South Klamath. . . the shop will be Steelox construction, built to company-engineered plans by the Bridge & Building crews of Great Northern. . . there may be some subcontracts on excavation and grading which is to be done as early in 1960 as weather will permit. . . In addition, some \$70,000 is earmarked for remodeling of the present GN dormitory at Bieber and new radio systems are to be installed at Bieber and at Bend. . . these are to be similar to the one already in use in Klamath Falls to provide inter-communication between trains and wayside stations. . . installation costs about \$3,000 each.

East Side Electric Co., 433 Market St., was low bidder at \$5,370 for a contract to improve the electrical system at the Veterans Memorial Bldg. in Klamath Falls last month.

When M-Sgt. A. G. Hudson retired after 24 years of active military duty last June 30, he left Kingsley Field and the 408th Fighter Group. . . with his wife and their partner, Lieut. Lloyd Wayne, a pilot at Kingsley Field, he purchased a house and nearly nine acres located on Old Midland Road and Airport Road to start a trailer court. . . they have named it "Sarges' Trailer Estates and M-Sgt. Chuck Bennett, who handles public relations for the field, was the first to move in. . . a total of 25 trailer spaces are ready for use and occupancy is not limited to military personnel. . . the set-up is entirely modern. . . electric and telephone cables are beneath ground and the site can be expanded to 50 spaces when needed. . . complete landscaping is planned for spring.

## Reports Err, Says Chief

SPOKANE (AP) — "Soviet schoolmasters have not discovered the key to any new educational breakthrough," Gov. Robert E. Smylie of Idaho told the Northwest College Personnel Assn. meeting Thursday. Smylie said what he saw of the Russian education system during a visit last summer "did not measure up to the glowing reports made about it."

"The major difference between Russian schools and ours was the intensity of effort. It seemed to me the kids were required to work harder and actually did work harder than in our schools. "Home work is a regular requirement. This would be a startling doctrine to most American grade school students."

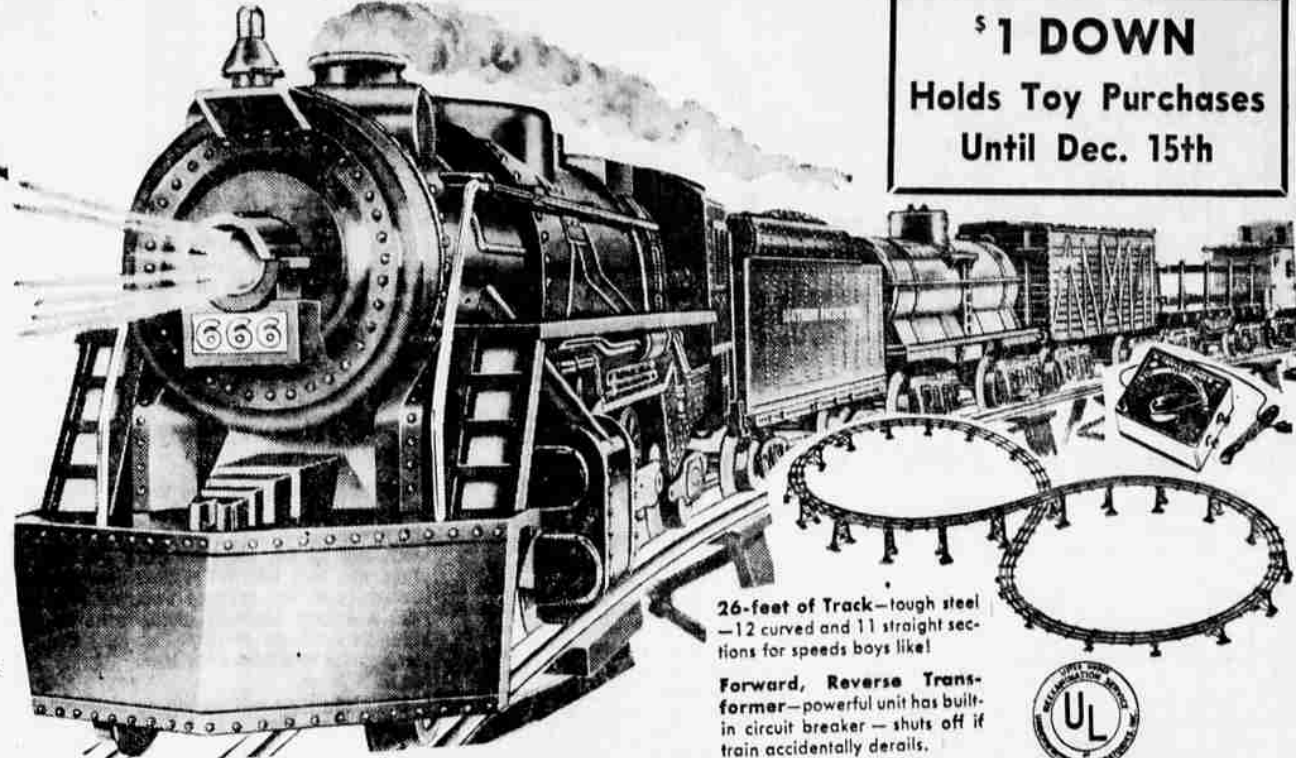

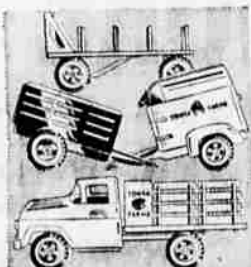

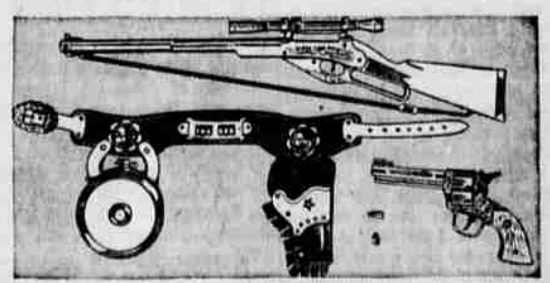
