

3 Government Branches Aim KO Of Labor Rackets

WASHINGTON (AP)—A knock-out blow is being aimed at labor rackets by all three branches of the federal government — executive, judicial and legislative.

Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell said the new labor law passed by Congress and administered by his department already is beginning to rid unions of corrupt elements. He said it also is giving union members a full voice in running their organizations.

Court-appointed monitors today charted a speedy new cleanup drive of the big scandal-ridden Teamsters Union.

The Supreme Court refused Monday to set aside lower court decisions arming the monitors with sweeping reform enforcement powers. Teamsters President James R. Hoffa said the union, though disappointed at the ruling, will "live up to the court's decision." But he said it still may challenge individual reform orders.

Martin F. O'Donoghue, monitor chairman, said his watchdog group now will move on a variety of fronts, including charges that could result in removal of Hoffa as president.

"We can move very fast now because the last legal roadblock is out of the way," O'Donoghue said before a strategy meeting with his two fellow monitor board members.

Mitchell, reporting on the first two months of operation of the anticorruption provisions of the new labor law, said some union officials with criminal or Communist backgrounds already have quit union office. He said nearly 100 complaints are under active investigation and some will be turned over to the Justice Department for prosecution.

Mitchell disclosed that the president of an independent Passaic, N.J., local quit during a Labor Department investigation into whether the official was continuing to serve despite a new ban against criminals or Communists holding union office.

Mitchell did not identify the individual. The secretary said a number of Teamsters officials have similarly been ousted.

"Reports from around the country indicate," Mitchell said, "that rank-and-file members of unions which have been mismanaged in the past are pleased with the results of the new law."

Mitchell said eight local unions which had been under trusteeship of their national unions have been returned to local control. This resulted, he said, from new supervisory powers the law gives his department.

FBI Agents Mull Case Of Runaway

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — The Jersey Central Railroad says its runaway locomotive may have been sent off deliberately by some one trying to sabotage the line.

The FBI also said it had entered the case to determine if there had been any violation of a federal train wreck statute.

A Central spokesman said Monday "It looks like some one maliciously sent the engine off. It's extremely unlikely the engine could get going by itself."

The 123-ton diesel-electric engine slid out of the Central yard in Jersey City Thursday night with no one aboard and highballed 22 miles down the tracks toward the Jersey shore before it was intercepted.

An engineer mounted a second locomotive in Perth Amboy, dashed ahead of the runaway locomotive, allowed it to catch up to him and hook on and then braked his engine to a halt.

The state Public Utility Commission also investigated the case. PUC President Ralph Fusco said the throttle on the engine was wide open and the brakes were on.

"It looks like the train crew left the train properly," the Central spokesman said. Several procedures have to be taken before the locomotive begins to move, the spokesman said.

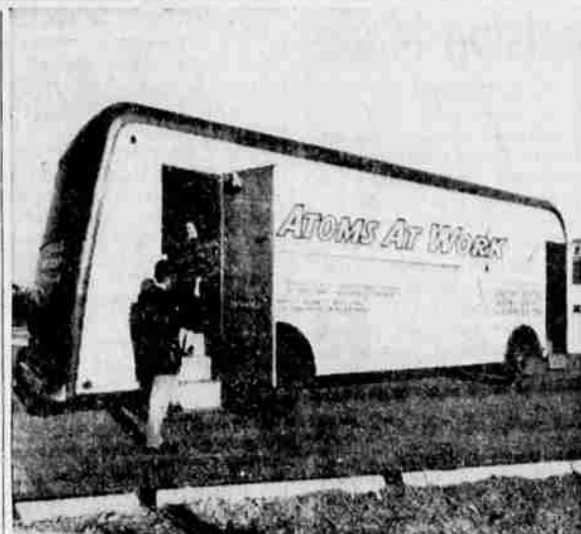

Help Given, But Lad Dies

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) — A 14-year-old boy died Monday night, two days after receiving a blood transfusion despite the objections of his parents, who said it violated the family's religious beliefs.

Clare L. Barrett, was admitted to University Medical Center last Wednesday with cystic fibrosis, a disease which causes internal bleeding.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. LeRoy Barrett of Temperance, Mich., refused to allow physicians to give him a blood transfusion. The Barretts, members of the Jehovah's Witnesses sect, said it violated their belief.

When the boy's condition, became worse Saturday, medical center officials obtained a court order making Clare a temporary ward of the state and clearing the way for a transfusion.

Barrett, father of seven other children, gave permission for an autopsy to determine cause of death.

"God is the judge," said Barrett, he said he bore no ill-will toward anyone despite the court order and transfusion.

Explosion Ripped Airliner; Search Crew Members Say

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Was there an explosion aboard the National Airlines DC7B liner that crashed in the Gulf of Mexico Monday with 42 persons aboard? If there was, did it come before or after the crash?

Members of the party hunting in the shark-infested waters for bodies believe there was an explosion. But they don't agree on when it occurred. There apparently were no survivors among the 36 passengers and 6 crew members to supply the answers.

The bodies of the six victims have been recovered. A Coast Guard cutter arrived at Gulfport, Miss., earlier today with them and debris from the wreck. A team of postal inspectors also was aboard the cutter. They had several sacks of mail.

The bodies were taken to Keesler Air Force Base Hospital in Biloxi, Miss.

Lt. James L. Sigman, executive officer of the Coast Guard air detachment in New Orleans, said the wreckage was spread over a comparatively small area of two to three miles. This indicated to him, he said, that the explosion came after the plane hit the water.

But two Air Force fliers who spent four hours over the scene said because the wreckage was so scattered it seemed to them the plane exploded in the air.

The two were Capt. Raymond M. Griswold, pilot of an S4E Albatross amphibian search and rescue plane, and Capt. Peter Palazzolo, the navigator.

"If the plane had been in a large piece or pieces when she hit the water, the wreckage would have been recovered."

THREE KILLED
KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — A brick wall collapsed Monday killing three men who were helping raise a one-story building in downtown Kansas City.

It took more than five hours to dig out the bodies of Fred Smith, 49; Giles Arnell Holloway, and Willie Brown, 40. Two other workmen escaped.

Five Perish In Accident
LONGVIEW, Wash. (AP)—Five teen-agers drowned Monday night when a car missed a turn at an intersection and plunged into a slough. A companion clawed his way to safety.

Francis Hughes, 16, told officers he didn't know how he escaped from the overturned car which landed in about 20 feet of water after sailing off a 25-foot cliff. He climbed the bank and flagged down a passing truck.

Skindivers managed to get a line on the vehicle hours later and rescue crews pulled it to the surface. Two bodies were found inside. Three others were recovered in dragging operations.

Hughes identified his companions as Doug Randolph, 17, driver of the car; Jerry Walston, 15; Floyd Walston, 13; Bill Webster, 16; and Dick Webster, 13.

have been more concentrated. It wouldn't have covered a five-mile area," Griswold said.

Both said the bodies they saw were floating face down and their clothes were ripped to shreds as if from an explosion.

Coast Guard rescue units patrolled the 300-foot deep waters searching for more bodies.

Nine bodies picked up Monday were brought to the Keesler Air Force Base hospital early today.

Charles Collar, in charge of the Civil Aeronautics Bureau investigation team, said the remains will be in the custody of a government pathological team flown in from Washington to look for evidence that may help the investigation.

A special FBI disaster investigation unit also is helping with the identification.
