Move—Mr. and Mrs. O'Neil Frazer, Paisley, are moving to Idaho for the winter where Frazer has been logging.

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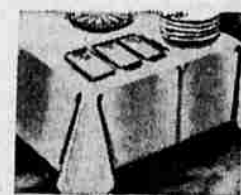


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
