

Mate Killed In Accident

McMINNVILLE, Ore. (AP) — A prominent McMinnville businessman Thursday night accidentally killed his wife on the eve of their wedding anniversary, Sheriff Bud Mekkers said.

Mekkers said Mrs. Leo Howard was wounded fatally when a spray of shot from an automatic shotgun her husband was attempting to clean caught her in the side as she stood nearby in the kitchen.

Mekkers and Coroner Glen Macy both agreed the shooting was accidental and said there would be no inquest.

Howard is a McMinnville beer distributor and a director of a lumber company.

Mrs. Howard also is survived by a son, Col. of Port Orford; a daughter Connie, at Oregon State College; and a daughter Judy, in high school here.

She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Lawson of Roseburg.

Judge Grants Man Desire

SYLVANIA, Ga. (UPI) — A defendant in the shooting of a local constable twitched nervously.

The jury was out deciding his fate. Then Tom Willie Evans, 55, rose from his chair and told the judge:

"I can take life. I can make it," he said.

Evans, who had pleaded innocent in the shotgun shooting of Constable Rufus C. Cleland, changed his plea to guilty.

Judge R. L. Renfro called back the startled jury and sentenced Evans to life.

"That's the most unusual proceedings I have witnessed in 37 years," said Evans' attorney, L.L. Odom.

Newspaper Rebirth Set

NEW YORK (UPI) — A magazine publisher said Thursday he would revive the Brooklyn Eagle, the 114-year-old newspaper which ceased publication in 1955.

Robert W. Farrell, who had been a columnist for the Eagle, said he had purchased the newspaper's name, good will and files for \$25,000.

Farrell said he expected to begin operations next year.

The Eagle ceased publication during a long strike by editorial employees, members of the New York Newspaper Guild. Its former publisher, Frank D. Schroth, recently settled back pay and severance claims clearing the way for Farrell to purchase the newspaper's assets.

CORVALLIS (AP) — Wayne Bodi, serving a 10-year sentence for the death of his 4-month-old daughter, has asked to be returned from the Oregon Correctional Institution to the Benton County Jail.

He filed a motion, contending he should be in Corvallis while the Supreme Court is considering his appeal from the conviction. John Fenner, Benton County district attorney, said that if the motion is granted, Bodi could be subject to release on bail.

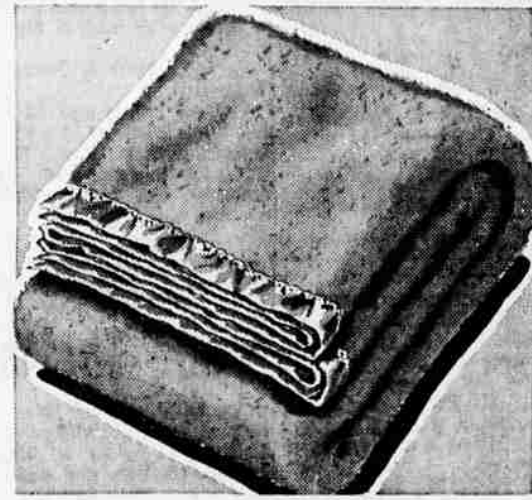

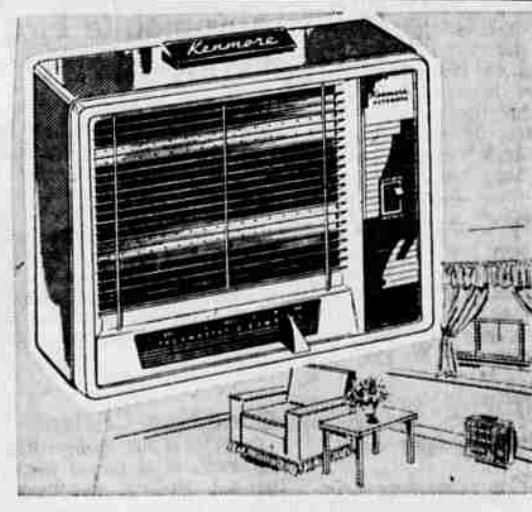
