

Lamar Hunt, Aides Deny AFL Pullout

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (UPI)—The American Football League headed into its first draft meeting today in a state of confusion. League spokesmen spent much of their time Sunday denying reports that backers of the newly formed AFL's Minneapolis-St. Paul franchise were pulling out. Charles Johnson, executive sports editor of the Minneapolis Star and Tribune, said a local group which had accepted an AFL franchise was withdrawing to accept a franchise for 1960 in the National Football League. The report was denied by Lamar Hunt, holder of the American League's Dallas franchise and principal organizer of the AFL. The league picked eight players as initial draft choices at a meeting Sunday night attended by representatives of the eight cities holding franchises—Boston, Buffalo, Dallas, Denver, Houston, Los Angeles, New York and Minneapolis.

Selections made Sunday night were: Boston—Gerhardt Schwedes, Syracuse halfback. Buffalo—Richie Lucas, Penn State quarterback. Dallas—Don Meredith, Southern Methodist quarterback. Denver—Rodger Le Clerc, Trinity College center. Houston—Billy Cannon, Louisiana State University halfback. Los Angeles—Monte Stickles, Notre Dame end. New York—George Izo, Notre Dame halfback.

Rocket Slows But Brother Takes Over

At 38, Maurice (Rocket) Richard is slowing down. But brother Henri Richard, 23, is playing like the Rocket did 15 years ago while helping the Montreal Canadiens set a fast pace in the National Hockey League.

Henri scored twice Sunday night as the flying Canucks extended their unbeaten string to 15 games by defeating Chicago 3-1. Jean Beliveau got the other goal for Montreal which maintained its six point lead over runner-up Detroit. The surprising Red Wings continued to roll, beating New York's hapless Rangers 5-3. Toronto edged Boston's injury-riddled Bruins 2-1 in the other game.

Eric Nesterenko got Chicago's lone marker early in the second period. However, the Hawks were unable to beat masked goalie Jacques Plante thereafter. The league record for successive unbeaten games is 23 set by Boston in 1940-41. Henri Richard's goals were his ninth and tenth of the year. Maurice has six.

Baer Funeral Set Tuesday

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (UPI)—Funeral services for Max Baer, onetime world's heavyweight boxing champion, will be held here Tuesday.

The rites will be conducted at the Chapel of the Valley and entombment will follow at St. Mary's Mausoleum.

The body of the sometime actor and good natured "clown prince of boxing" was flown here from Hollywood. Baer died Saturday of a double heart attack.

Baer is survived by his widow, Mary; two sons, Max Jr. and James; a daughter, Maude; two sisters, Mrs. James Young and Mrs. Louie Santucci; and two brothers, Jacob Henry (Buddy) and Augie.

Baer won the heavyweight championship in June of 1934 when he scored a 10th round knockout of Primo Carnera.

Charley Conerly and Johnny Unitas are steering their teams toward a replay of last year's sudden death struggle for the National Football League championship.

The 28-year-old Conerly, a veteran of 12 pro football campaigns, fired a New York second half rally with two touchdown passes Sunday as the Giants whipped Chicago's Cardinals 30-20 and took over sole possession of first place in the Eastern Conference.

Still hobbled by the ankle injury that had sidelined him for two games, Conerly pitched 33 yards to Frank Gifford and one TD and arched a 45-yarder to Bob Schnelker for another score to erase a 14-13 Cardinal lead.

Equally adept at the quarterback post, the 26-year-old Unitas led Baltimore to a 45-14 thumping of San Francisco. The triumph enabled the defending champion

Brave Pilot Maps Plans Against LA

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP)—Charlie Dressen, who left a comfortable coaching job with the world champion Los Angeles Dodgers to become manager of Milwaukee, already is mapping plans to beat his old mates.

"I know a few things about the Dodgers," Dressen told Wisconsin sports writers and sportscasters Sunday night at a dinner. "We'll try and disturb them a little bit next year."

The 61-year-old veteran, who piloted the Dodgers to pennants in 1952 and '53 long before the club's move to the West Coast, predicted the Braves would have a much better team next season—and will win the pennant if they can stay healthy.

"I just hope Aaron doesn't get hurt, Mathews doesn't get hurt, Crandall doesn't get hurt, Logan doesn't get hurt, Covington stays well and the pitching staff stays healthy," he said. "Then I'm damn sure we'll win the pennant."

Dressen, a fiery leader on the field who is noted for his witty comments as a speaker, said the Dodgers won the pennant by beating Milwaukee and San Francisco.

Dressen noted that the Braves had the major league batting champion in Hank Aaron and the home run king in Eddie Mathews.

"You've gotta have talent to win and we have it here," he said. "We're going to be a better team. That's the reason I took the job. I did very good in the other job (as manager at Brooklyn) and I think I can do better in this one."

Dressen predicted that it would take more than 63 victories to win the National League flag next season. The Dodgers took the pennant with that number, including two straight playoff triumphs against the Braves this year.

NEW YORK (UPI)—Billy Hunter of Detroit is a slight favorite at 6-5 to beat Alex Miteff of Argentina at Madison Square Garden Friday night in their return heavyweight contenders' TV fight, which tops this week's light holiday boxing schedule.

Hunter stopped Miteff in the seventh round at Syracuse, N.Y., Sept. 25 because of a cut brow, but the Argentine boxer-puncher appeared to be coming on at the time.

Friday's nationally televised (NBC) 10-rounder between Hunter, ranked ninth among contenders, and Miteff, rated 10th, will be the only TV fight of the week. A musical TV spectacular takes over the Wednesday night fight.

Prothro Says Game Good, Season Bad

Oregon State's victory over Oregon was a nice way to end the football season, OSC Coach Tommy Prothro said Sunday. He added, though, that for Oregon State it wasn't much of a season.

"It's real good. But it's better to have a better season," Prothro said.

Oregon State ended the year with a mediocre 3-7 record, the worst for Prothro since he became head coach here.

The Beavers lost several games by a whisper this year, and of that Prothro said:

"We had a lot of problems handling the ball."

The Beavers became known as rather a fumbling team this year, and against Oregon Saturday at Eugene fumbled the first two times they got the ball.

Oregon State quickly found some poise, though, and went on to topple the favored Oregon squad 15-7.

For Oregon, it was only the second time in 10 games this season that the Ducks had been beaten. It ended their thin hopes for the Rose Bowl.

What did Prothro credit with the victory?

"They were well scouted," he said. "But most of all it was just the determination of our players."

Prothro said the Oregon State line rushed extremely well, putting so much pressure on Oregon's flashy Dave Groz that the quarterback completed but 6 of 20 passes for a scant 29 yards. Two of his passes were intercepted.
