

### Siam Twins Continue Gain

PORTLAND (AP)—The Stubblefield Siamese twins, nearing 5 months of age, continue to show progress after delicate surgery that separated them Oct. 6, at a University of Oregon Medical School Hospital spokesman said Monday.

He reported they are gaining weight steadily and "are laughing and playing with toys a little."

The girls, Jeannet and Denett, were born June 29 to Mr. and Mrs. James Stubblefield of Parma, Idaho. Before the operation they were joined face to face from the breastbone to the navel.

The spokesman said the twins probably will not be released to go home until additional surgery is performed in an effort to strengthen their stomach areas.

He said money was needed here now to pay funeral expenses and support the family.

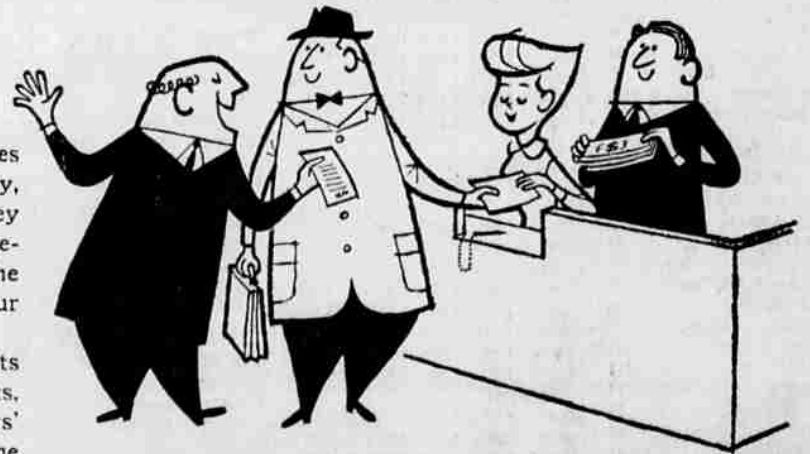

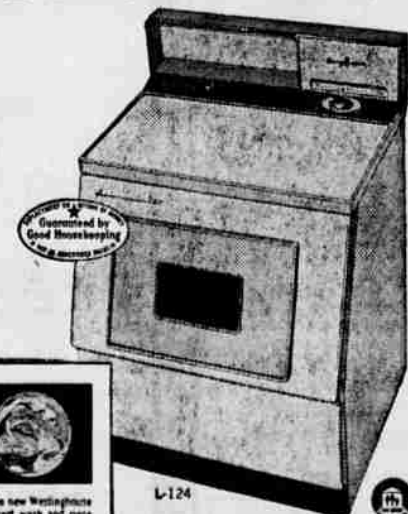
