Cheery Lion Gives Thanks

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. (AP) — George, the light-hearted lion, has something to be thankful for today. He's wanted.

Not by the boys back at city jail where he bunked Tuesday night. "He grows too much," commented one of George's cell block mates.

Not by the Lincoln Park Zoo here where he spent Wednesday romping in a regulation lion's den. "There just isn't room for him," said zoo director Dr. Warren Thomas.

But on Thanksgiving Eve news of George's plight reached the Tulsa Park Board and board chairman Gordon T. Hicks commented: "If the animal is something the park superintendent and the zoo personnel believe will make a valuable addition to our collection, we will take him."

George, a docile 70-pound cub, was a dubious addition to the Oklahoma City jail. His former owner, Ted Moore, found him equally distracting.

Happy days for the gentle cat ended Tuesday night when Moore turned him over to the city jail. George was booked on an open charge and held until zoo officials took him.

"He's too big," Moore told a startled jailer. "He has taken over my apartment and now he has grown too fond of trying to drive my car."

Resources Delay Reply

SALEM (AP) — The Oregon Natural Resources Committee Tuesday delayed until Jan. 12 its reply to the new proposal by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) to create a national park in the dunes area near Florence.

The committee is headed by Gov. Mark Hatfield and consists of heads of nine state resource agencies. It decided it wasn't ready to act Tuesday because only three of the nine agencies have studied the question.

After the committee's original objections, Neuberger revised his plan. The committee now will reply to this revision.

At the Jan. 12 meeting, the committee will go through Neuberger's new proposal section by section.

"The committee," Gov. Hatfield said, "didn't oppose the national seashore program, but had reservations about that proposal."

"We stand for developing our resources and our recreation potential to the fullest, but we might disagree on essentials."

"We hope we will be able to give our full support."

Believe Bull Killed Cleric

HARRISBURG, Ore. (AP) — A minister's body was found on his farm Tuesday. Authorities said it appeared he had been killed by a bull.

The body of the Rev. Ferris Dodd, 60, semi-retired Assembly of God minister, was found on his farm 11 miles east of here.

The minister's body was found beside a farm lane after he had got out to herd some cattle to the barn and failed to return.

Later, corner's deputy Myron Buchanan said he found signs of a struggle beside the lane.

He said the minister apparently had tried to flee to safety behind a post but became a helpless victim after becoming entangled in a fence.

There was no immediate indication, he said, which of the several bulls on the ranch had killed the minister.

Paper Says Nets Split

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Times said today that the NBC and CBS networks were sharply divided on what steps to take toward policing television standards.

The newspaper's Jack Gould said "The National Broadcasting Co. favors joint participation by sponsors and advertising agencies, as well as broadcasters, in establishing a 'public policy committee' to review video's standards and policies."

"The Columbia Broadcasting System declines to join the venture lest it be an admission that the network has abdicated its responsibility to advertisers and agencies."

The American Broadcasting Co., the story says, "would not discuss its position but was understood to be very lukewarm toward a citizens' review board."

The newspaper tells of "an unpublished session" here Nov. 13 of TV bigwigs with Sigurd S. Larmon, board chairman of Young & Rubicam, Inc., advertising agency, and an advocate of a citizens committee to scrutinize the industry.

At this meeting, the Times says, were Leonard Goldenson, board chairman of ABC; Oliver Treyz, ABC president; Frank Stanton, CBS president; Robert W. Sarnoff, board chairman of NBC; and Robert Kintner, NBC president.

Solon Rapped By Filipino

MANILA (AP) — A ranking Philippine senator today accused U.S. Rep. Phil Weaver (R-Neb.) of causing grave harm to Philippine-American relations.

Sen. Lorenzo Sumulong accused "some 'Ugly Americans' on U.S. bases here" of inspiring a blistering statement against the Philippines which Weaver issued on Wednesday.

Weaver charged that a "graft-ridden" Philippine government is conducting an "open program of harassment of American officers and men" and that American servicemen are subject to looting, extortion and assault.

The congressman, who spent three days in the Philippines this month as a member of the House.

Debate Set On Hungary

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The U.N. General Assembly will hold its annual debate on Hungary despite Soviet warnings that another airing of the issue will increase international tensions.

Overriding the Soviet bloc and Communist Yugoslavia, the Assembly voted 51-10 Wednesday night in favor of a steering committee recommendation for the debate. Finland, Israel and 13 members of the Asian-African bloc abstained.

Vasily V. Kuznetsov, Soviet deputy foreign minister, accused U.S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge of fabricating reports of brutalities in Communist Hungary to help push through the vote for debate. He said the Assembly was taking a "dangerous path—the path of straining relations between states."

Lodge told the Assembly he regretted to bring up the matter at a time when there is hope for a genuine thaw in the cold war. He said "to attempt to sweep crimes like these under the rug will not cause these hopes to be fulfilled and will not promote peace."

Crash Charge Refuted By Air Aide

PORTLAND (AP) — General Airways was not responsible for the crash of a transport plane that carried 23 Idaho Air National Guardsmen, a spokesman for the firm said Tuesday.

3 Escapees Captured

JACKSON, Ohio (AP) — Three escapees from a North Carolina road gang, wanted for murder of a guard, were captured by Ohio Highway Patrol officers Tuesday night.

Patrolmen closed in from two directions to nab the three men who were stopping autos on U.S. 33 east of here. Officers said the men apparently were attempting to switch cars.

A truck driver saw a car pulled off the road and noted it carried Virginia license plates which he had seen on a wanted notice. He notified the patrol.

Patrol units moved into position, and motorists were warned not to pick up any hitchhikers. Then patrolmen moved in on the trio. Two of the men were in the roadway. The third was in the car. They offered no resistance.

Five men broke away from a road gang near Jefferson, N.C., Monday, fatally wounding the work gang foreman, Fields Abner, 35. They fled in the prison truck. They later terrorized a woman, taking the keys to her car in which they continued their flight.

Three of the men commandeered a car at gunpoint in Beckley, W. Va., Tuesday.

The three men arrested are Tommy Stiles, 27, of Asheville, N.C.; George Brown, 29, of North Wilkesboro, N.C.; and John Allan Henry, of Miami, Fla.

The two other escapees, James T. Waller, 35, and John W. Burgess Jr., 33, are being sought in Sterling County, W. Va. Reports say they may have been sighted in that area.

Ex-Flynn Wife Named Guardian

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A court has appointed Nora Eddington, actor Errol Flynn's second wife, guardian of their two daughters, Deirdre, 14, and Rory, 12.

The action permits Miss Eddington, 35, to take charge of insurance money and of \$10,000 will to each of the children by the actor.

Flynn, 50, died Oct. 14 in Vancouver, B.C. His estate is being probated in New York.

"The captain made the flight on his own. He arranged it with the central control board of all carriers in Washington, D.C., and without authorization from General Airways," said Mrs. George Callas, wife of the firm's president.

General Airways went into bankruptcy Sept. 17.

The plane owned and operated by General Airways crashed near Kerrville, Texas, last Feb. 1 after taking off on a flight from Boise, Idaho, the Civil Aeronautics Board said.

The CAB said in Washington, D.C., Tuesday that it attributed poor judgment by the pilot as the probable cause of the crash.

The pilot was Capt. Woodrow W. Epps, 42, Portland. He and two other men aboard the plane were killed.

In releasing the details of its investigation, the CAB said it had found that the crew of the plane—which was transporting the guardsmen under a Defense Department contract—had been on duty more than 40 hours.

In addition, the CAB said that despite severe icing conditions, "the captain pressed on to complete a mission long after good judgment called for discontinuing the flight."

The CAB said that if there had been a delay in the flight, the airline would have had to pay for the housing and feeding of the passengers delayed on route.

"The inevitable conclusion is that economic factors rather than the basic principles of safe flight were dominant," the CAB said.

In Portland, Mrs. Callas said: "It is true the crew had been on duty 40 hours, but that would not have happened if the captain had not taken the flight without authorization."

Mrs. Callas, who said she was speaking in the absence of her husband, said the airline had never had a passenger fatality in its history.

VOICE PROVES GUILTY

WINTON, N.C. (UPI) — Roosevelt Slaughter, a 22-year-old Negro, was fined \$25 and court costs Tuesday after a 13-year-old white girl identified him by his voice as one of the four Negroes she said made rude remarks about her.

Charges against three other Negroes were dropped when the girl, whose name was withheld, was unable to identify them.
