Ex-Commando Arrested

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — A husky former Commando with a sharp sense of humor was arrested here Thursday for an Australian embezzlement estimated as high as two million dollars — although he admitted he "never counted it."

Kevin Richard Gale, 35, was arrested in a small tenderloin hotel and had only \$20 in his possession. "I never carry much cash," he said.

Gale told arresting officers they almost arrived too late. He had his bags packed and was ready to leave for Mexico or Brazil because he had heard Australia has no extradition treaties with those nations.

The muscular suspect said he operated a collection agency in Sydney and that after a year he decided to leave the country with funds that should have been given to Sydney business firms. He said he didn't know how much money he took.

"I never counted it. The Australian newspapers claimed it was \$300,000 and the auditors later fixed it at two million. I guess that was it. Anyway, it was a lot of money."

Gale said about \$20,000 of the money is being held by friends, but he spent most of it on a trip around the world. "I hit all the places," he said, "the Middle East, London, Italy..."

He said he came to New York a month ago and has been touring the United States since. Gale was arrested on a warrant from the Australian attorney general and the state of New South Wales charging grand theft in the amount of 3,470 pounds (\$8,807).

An Australian Consulate official said an officer of the New South Wales police would travel here for Gale's hearing before U. S. Commissioner Joseph Karesch. Gale said he would fight extradition, but only until the officer arrives.

"It isn't every day a copper gets a free trip to the United States," he said.

Suicide Note Implicates Ex-Plumber

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — "No one else is involved in this terrible mess but Johnnie Hendrickson."

Soon after writing those words in a suicide note, Long Beach banker George A. Hewlett shot himself through the heart and ended his part in what may have been the biggest bank embezzlement ever perpetrated in the United States.

Nearly four million dollars is involved in the swindle. John R. Hendrickson, 40, who rose in five years from a once bankrupt plumber to a business tycoon, was indicted Wednesday by a federal grand jury for his part in the scheme which assertedly hiked the East Long Beach branch of the U. S. Bank of San Diego of \$3,714,710.

"We haven't used any of this ourselves," Hewlett's note continued. "It has all gone to John."

But Hendrickson, who filed bankruptcy proceedings in 1955 and now owns six California business firms and lives in a palatial \$75,000 bayside home with his wife and seven children in San Rafael, Calif., claimed he knew nothing about the embezzlement when taken into custody.

Federal investigators, however, found 83 cashiers checks totaling \$927,000 in Hewlett's garage, all made out to Hendrickson.

Also found were five checks signed by Hendrickson totaling \$75,000 and marked "insufficient funds," plus a half million dollars more in checks made out to one of Hendrickson's seven firms.

Today the wealthy manufacturer awaits a Dec. 7 hearing to answer charges in connection with what U.S. Atty. Laughlin E. Waters termed—the largest embezzlement in this country's banking history.

Protestants Hit Bishops

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A statement by U. S. Catholic bishops opposing any use of foreign aid funds to promote artificial birth control in overpopulated countries has been attacked strongly by two Protestant leaders.

Episcopal Bishop James A. Pike of San Francisco said the stand taken by the Catholic hierarchy would "condemn rapidly increasing millions of people in less fortunate parts of the world to starvation, bondage, misery and despair."

He demanded to know whether the policy enunciated by the bishops is "binding on Roman Catholic candidates for public office."

Dr. John C. Bennett, dean of Union Theological Seminary in New York, said it was tragic to see Catholic leaders pressing "a point of view on birth control which has no sound moral or religious basis, and which has been rejected by most other Christian groups."

The Catholic statement, issued here Wednesday night on behalf of more than 200 U. S. cardinals, archbishops and bishops, charged that "pessimistic population predictions" are trying to stampede the United States into an "immoral policy" of promoting birth control measures in underdeveloped countries.

Decision Revised By High Court

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The Pennsylvania Supreme Court says it doesn't believe a seven-year-old child is competent to give testimony in a court case.

In an unanimous decision Wednesday the Supreme Court reversed a Common Pleas Court judgment awarding damages to Dennis Rosche, who was struck by an auto in Sharon, Pa. Dennis was five at the time.

Justice Thomas D. McBride, who wrote the decision, said the judge "abused his discretion" in allowing the testimony of Carolyn Laou, a playmate of Dennis who witnessed the accident.

A new trial was ordered.

Fire Razes Warehouse

MODESTO (UPI) — Damage from a spectacular fire which destroyed the half-block long Boothe Fruit Co. warehouse late Thursday was expected today to total nearly a half million dollars.

The blaze was discovered about 5 p.m., 24 hours after the warehouse had been closed for the Thanksgiving holiday. Origin of the fire was not determined immediately.

The warehouse had been used to pack Citations for the Army. The fire resulted in a general three-alarm call for Modesto firefighters who later requested assistance from Stanislaus County fire units. All fire duty foreman in the city were alerted and the police department ordered out reserves to patrol the area attracted to the blaze.
