Use of anthrax spore vaccine is permitted in the Fort Klamath and Klamath Marsh sections (by permit only) through amendment of State Department of Agriculture regulations, according to Fred Pope, chief of the division of animal industry for the department. . . . drug stores and others legally authorized to sell this vaccine may sell it to livestock operators with valid permits from the State Department of Agriculture. . . . sellers must keep records of date, quantity of vaccine sold, permit number and name and address of buyer. . . . sales records must be kept for at least two years.

More than 700 million miles were driven on Oregon streets and highways during September, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles, and for each 100 million miles driven, 6.5 persons were killed in accidents. . . . September mileage was nearly 100 million miles higher than for that month a year ago when 5.5 persons were killed for every 100 million miles of driving. . . . 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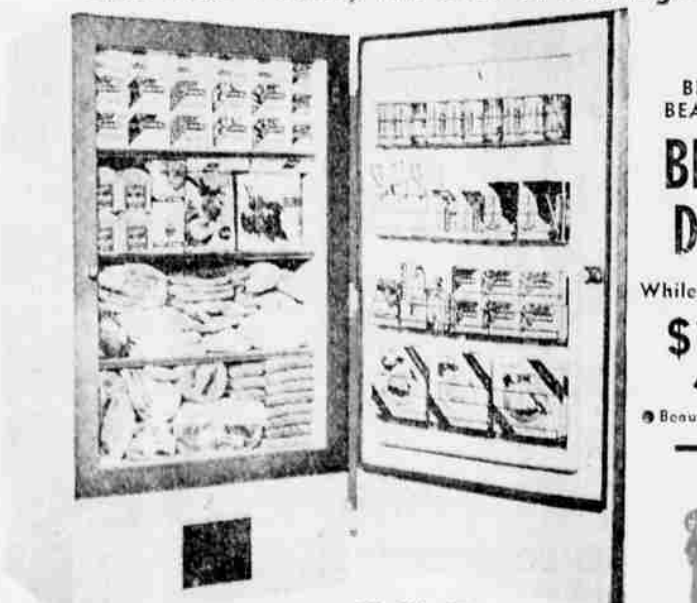

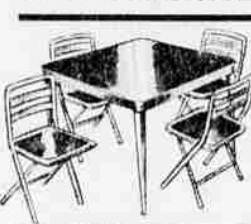
