Bear's Home Not In Sight

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Little Mike Plaugher had a good chance today of getting the one Christmas present he wants most — a left hand.

Six-year-old Mike was born without the hand.

His father, an 8½-week television and radio repairman who lives with his family of seven in nearby Alexandria, Va., said offers of money have been coming in steadily since Mike's story was publicized.

The father, Irvin Plaugher, said "letters and checks are pouring in." He told United Press International that three anonymous donors, two from New York and one from Boston, have offered to pay the full costs of equipping Mike with an artificial hand.

He said \$27 in donations came by mail and telegram Tuesday and that he was informed a Warrenton, Va., radio station had collected another \$177. He said all donations would go in a trust fund.

\$2 Bills Aid Survey

ABERDEEN, Md. (AP) — The Army paid some 5,000 enlisted men at Aberdeen Proving Ground in \$2 bills this week in an effort to determine the buying habits of soldiers.

Col. G. F. Powell, deputy commander of the post, ordered the distribution of 175,000 \$2 bills, which represents almost 10 percent of Aberdeen's \$3,750,000 monthly payroll for 10,000 military and civilian workers.

The Army said it hopes to receive reports on the "informal survey" from banks, grocery stores and other retail establishments.

Guardian Named For Star's Mom

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A court has appointed a conservator to handle the affairs of Gladys Eley, 57, actress Marilyn Monroe's mother.

The court named Inez C. Nelson, Miss Monroe's ex-business manager, after being told the actress approved.

Because of illness, the court was told, Mrs. Eley, also known as Gladys Baker, is confined to a sanitarium and cannot handle her own affairs. Miss Monroe did not attend the hearing Wednesday.

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Governors Invite Reds

WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, W. Va. (AP) —

The American governors who went to the Soviet Union last summer have invited their counterparts to repay the visit. The invitation, not yet made formally, suggests the trip be made early next spring, but leaves the time open.

Gov. J. Caleb Boggs, of Delaware, chairman of the National Governors' Conference, said the chairman of the Soviet districts would be expected to pay their own way.

He said formal invitations are to be issued through the State Department and the Soviet Embassy.

Boggs made the announcement Wednesday night. He said he had no idea what portions of the country the Soviets would want to see.

The governors gave unanimous support to a proposal by the roads committee that the governors ask President Eisenhower and congressional leaders for a conference early next January to discuss speeding up the cut-down federal superhighway program.

The roads committee, headed by Gov. Abraham Ribicoff of Connecticut, protested that allocations to the states under the 1956 program had been cut drastically below earlier estimates, and that the states have been left out on a financial limb. The conference was proposed to work on a mutual solution.

Pupils Contest Term Extension

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) —

A class of seventh graders has challenged the Kentucky Education Assn.'s proposal for a 10-month school term.

In a letter to the "State Legislature of Kentucky" the 31 students at Martin School in Floyd County put it this way:

"If some of America's great leaders such as Abraham Lincoln attended school only three months or less a year, why should we attend 10 months?"

The pupils said the extra money which would be involved could be used for other things — even for teacher salary increases.

Future War Horror Told

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (AP) —

A Japanese radiation expert believes a future atomic war would be "too terrible even to imagine" and 1,000 times more terrible than the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki during World War II.

Yasushi Nishiwaki, newly appointed professor of radiation protection at the Tokyo Institute of Technology, spoke Wednesday night at St. John's College.

Nishiwaki, a research fellow at the California Institute of Technology, said "in order to prevent a total nuclear war, everyone must work very hard for its prevention."

Utilities Mixup All Squared Now

MT. STERLING, Ky. (AP) —

A Mt. Sterling hardware store discovered last year it had been paying a supply store's water bill for 14 years because of a meter mix-up.

It's all squared now.

The supply firm discovered this week it had been paying the hardware firm's electric bill for 15 years for the same reason.

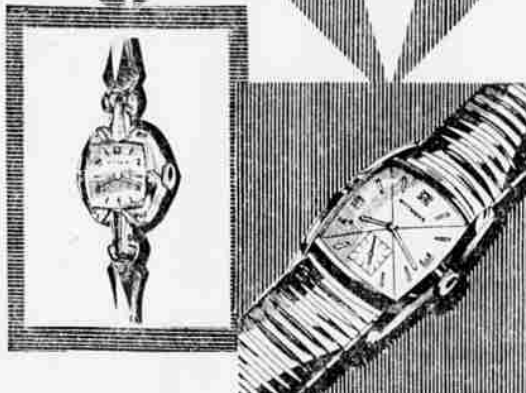
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
