ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — Junior operators' licenses for drivers under 18 should be eliminated, says the chairman of the Joint Legislative Committee on Motor Vehicles.

Officer Lists Timber Values

"Timber is a renewable resource — it cannot be stored like oil — we either harvest it scientifically or we waste it."

The guest speaker was introduced by Charles Glidden, of Klamath Lumber and Box Company, president of the local chapter.

In order to determine the timber potential, it is necessary to learn many things about our timber, he stated.

"There is a wide divergence of opinion among industry leaders, federal timber management agencies and economists regarding the potential supply of timber and how fast we should get to utilizing this supply," McCracken said.

McCracken pointed out that British Columbia has a very aggressive forest policy. It is estimated that British Columbia has more timber than all of the forest service timber in the United States put together, he asserted.

This Canadian province already sells 50 per cent of its products manufactured from its timber in the United States, he declared.

"If we develop our forest industries, we can sell our manufactured products," McCracken continued. "If we do not develop our forest industries to their potential, Canada will replace us and cause our forest industries to decline."

McCracken concluded by advocating a consistent plan of forest management and cutting among the private owners and public timber management agencies in order that the maximum yield can be realized from this great natural resource.

Nearly 60 foresters and guests attended Friday's meeting. The January meeting will be held in Lakeview at a time and place to be announced.

Voters Spurn Earl K. Long

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) — Having been cast aside by the voters in favor of more decorous candidates, Gov. Earl K. Long faced a future of fast declining power in Louisiana government and politics today.

He ran third in a field of six candidates for lieutenant governor — the low prevented him from running for governor — in a Democratic primary election Saturday and James A. Noe, 67, whom Long backed for governor, ran fourth.

In his home parish (county of Winn) voters refused to elect him to the Central Democratic Committee. Long, 64, will serve as governor until next May.

The faith of voters in him evidently was shaken by his escapades last summer during a southwestern tour, plans to divorce his wife and his public identification with strip teases Blaze Starr and a woman recently arrested for soliciting.

Spacers Test New Missile, Plan Probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — Space scientists have announced a successful test of a new type rocket engine and plans to orbit a trio of Echo satellites.

The nation's first rocket engine fueled with liquid hydrogen—the huge XLR115—has been test fired successfully, the Pentagon disclosed Sunday. The engine produced a kick 30 per cent greater than current kerosene-fueled rocket engines.

Plans for launching of the three Echo satellites—the first of them perhaps next March—were announced by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. The balloon-like spheres will be as tall as 16-story buildings and will be fired into orbit 1,000 miles above the earth.

Scientists around the world have been invited to try to bounce radio signals off the big aluminum-coated spheres.

The three satellites to be used in the global communications experiment will be similar to the one inflated Oct. 28 about 250 miles above Wallops Island, Va.

Thousands of residents along 1,000 miles of the Eastern seaboard saw that glistening sphere.

The Echo satellites to be launched next spring from Cape Canaveral, Fla., will be by far the largest objects ever rocketed to such heights. They will be 100 feet in diameter but will weigh only 150 pounds.

Natives Ask Mission Ban

RABAUL, New Britain (UPI)—Natives of this Australian-administered island have appealed to local authorities not to admit any more missionaries.

"The missions have done much for the natives, but there are too many of them," said Stanis Boralamit, spokesman for the island's 500,000 people.

"The mind of the native is confused. He hears the missions say they are all Christian, yet they differ from each other. We don't want any more coming from Australia, and we ask you to keep them out."

Australian authorities said the terms of their U. N. trusteeship over the island do not permit them to exclude missionaries. They suggested that the natives petition the United Nations for relief.

Twenty-eight religious orders, representing 10 Christian sects, are operating missions in New Britain.

Although Alaska has the smallest population—191,000—it shows the largest increase, a whopping 48.8 per cent.
