BOSTON (UPI) — Federal Judge Francis J. W. Ford peered at defendant Joseph D. Rosati. "Anything to say?" the judge asked Rosati, charged with violating probation by beating his wife, Florence, 22.

MT. UNION, Pa. (UPI) — A Pennsylvania Railroad express train, carrying about 140 passengers, derailed in a rugged mountain area of central Pennsylvania early today.

Three persons were injured when the crack New York to Cleveland train, the Cleveland, left the rails about 12:30 a.m. e.s.t. after striking a piece of machinery apparently dropped by another westbound train.

Dempsey L. Sutton, 21, 1896 E. 26th St., Cleveland, was admitted to Lewisstown General Hospital with hand and leg injuries. Mrs. Jo Ann Mulligan, about 25, 4505 East-West Hwy., Bethesda, Md., and John Morgan, 48, 407 E. Luton St., New Castle, Pa., a railroad employee, were hospitalized in Huntingdon with shock and contusions.

Several other passengers were shaken up when two coaches left the rails. A heavier toll of injuries was avoided because the coaches did not overturn. Four sleeping cars remained on the tracks.

A three-unit diesel locomotive, to express, baggage and mail cars and a diner derailed.
