### Pair Attends Church Meet

The Rev. and Mrs. Marshall A. McKinnie of the First Congregational Church were present at Pacific University, Forest Grove, December 7 and 8 when a seminar was conducted by Dr. and Mrs. Douglas Horton, distinguished in the fields of American religion and education for more than a generation. From 70 to 80 Congregational Church ministers and their wives were in attendance.

The Rev. and Mrs. Horton were sponsored by the newly formed United Church of Christ.

Dr. Horton served from 1955 until this year as dean of Harvard Divinity School with previous years as a minister and executive secretary of the General Council of the Congregational Christian Churches and as moderator of the International Congregational Council. He is chairman of the board of the American University in Cairo and a trustee of Princeton University.

Mrs. Horton also has a long record of service in foreign mission work and was the first woman to be commissioned by the Navy holding the rank of captain when she resigned in 1946. She was president of Wellesley College from 1936 to 1949.

Dr. and Mrs. Horton make their home at Randolph, New Hampshire.

### Dance Club Celebrates New Hall

The Merry Mixers of Klamath Falls are presenting their new square dancing hall for public inspection Saturday from 2 p.m. until midnight on Lakeport Boulevard across from the Car-Ad-Co mill.

They will serve refreshments and dance in the evening in a sort of thanksgiving celebration. The opening culminates a lot of work and a big expenditure.

Members estimated the rejuvenated building would be worth \$8,000 or \$9,000 now. "It's a real asset to the community," says Lynn Lee, Merry Mixers president.

They bought the crumbling structure from Car-Ad-Co incorporated this fall. It used to be the

company store. But it hadn't been used for a long time. The ceiling was full of holes, the floor sagging. Windows were shattered. "It was in mighty poor shape," said a member.

Some building materials were donated. The club bought more. The dancers put in a new floor, roof, windows, plumbing and electrical wiring and an acoustic ceiling. They converted the basement from "a swamp to a kitchen and dining room."

Formerly, the club moved from one meeting hall to another for their Friday evening dances, and Wednesday dancing lessons.

Now the club has come of age, with a walloping 62-couple membership and more knocking at the door.

The club began in the fall of 1954 under coxing of Mr. and

Mrs. Bill Mayhew of Klamath Falls. The couple began teaching other couples to dance in squares and rounds.

The Mayhews still instruct—the square technique, and she, the round. Mayhew does most of the calling. Classes are each Wednesday at 8 p.m. Each lesson costs \$1 per couple, and they teach one each week for 16 weeks — until novices learn some skill in basic movements.

Dances are conducted at 8 p.m. each Friday except on the second

of each month. On the second Saturday, the club invites a guest caller. Dancers from all over Northern California and Southern Oregon come for fun and a pot-luck dinner.
