Merrill Cagers Grab County League Lead

The Merrill Huskies snapped the deadlock for first place in the Klamath County B League basketball standings with a narrow 37-34 victory over the Bonanza Antlers at Bonanza Tuesday night.

The win gives the Merrill cagers a 2-0 mark for conference play.

In other action the Bly Bobcats scared the Sacred Heart Trojans before finally bowing 45-37 on the Bly court.

The Malin Mustangs slipped past the Chiloquin Panthers 36-30 on the Chiloquin floor.

The Gilchrist Grizzlies dumped LaPine 56-43 at Gilchrist, and, in a non-league encounter the Henley Hornets swarmed over the KU Wildcats to the tune of a 53-27 buzzing.

Merrill 37, Bon. 34

Paced by the 23-point effort of county high-scorer Bruce Bricker, who connected on nine shots from the floor and five of six tries at the free throw line, the Huskies led narrowly, 17-14 at the midway point.

The Bonanza battlers were led by Jim O'Connor who poured in 11 points, followed by Sylvan Crum who accounted for 10. Chet

Schooler added eight for the Antlers while the number two Merrill point-producer was Rich Carleton who collected six.

In the JV game the Bonanzans won 38-28 over the Merrill Pups.

There's More To Penn State Than Richie Lucas

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) — So much has been written about

Richie Lucas, Penn State's triple-threat quarterback, that Liberty Bowl fans may be surprised to learn there are other players on the team.

Alabama, of course, is fully aware of the sturdy line Coach Rip Engle will play Saturday at Philadelphia Stadium. It also has been alerted to the breakaway threat of Roger Kochman — pronounced Coffman — the sophomore halfback who returned a kickoff 100 yards against Syracuse.

But the average football fan regards Penn State as Richie Lucas, Pae.

Kochman, a former high school sprint champion, is an 18-year-old flash from Pittsburgh. Engle had hoped to hold Kochman out of action for a year and thus preserve his eligibility. But State needed him against West Virginia and Syracuse. He was injured early in the Holy Cross game and missed the Pittsburgh disaster.

He may start at left half instead of Dick Hoak if State gets the ball first.

Pat Butala, a solid fullback who averages better than three yards a try, will get relief from Sam Sobczak.

Engle normally substitutes by units but he has indicated he will depart from his practice against Alabama, using individual subs.

At the ends Engle will start John Bozick and Bob Mitinger. Andy Stynchula and Charles Jan-

ere, a 234-pounder, will be at the tackles with Earl Kohlhaas

and Bill Popp at guards and sophomore Jay Hoffman at center.

Both Stynchula and Janerett were picked in the professional draft.

"There is nothing flashy about our line," said Engle, "but they like to hit hard and mix it up."

Lucas is outstanding. He broke Lenny Moore's record for yards gained in a season by a Penn State player. He runs, throws, punts and shines on defense.

For the Alabama game, Engle has promoted Dick Pae, a pint-sized (5-9) halfback, to a starting role.

"He has tremendous desire," said Engle, explaining his move advancing Pae past Jim Kerr. "Pae played better against Pitt. Maybe Kerr will be the better man Saturday, but I'm starting Pae."

Blankenship, the Siskiyou League's leading scorer with 74 markers in four games for an impressive 18.3 mark, was the only Cougar to hit in double figures, but of the 12 players used by Weed coach Al Shipman, 10 scored.

The game, which saw the Weed quint charged with 24 personal fouls and Lassen 20, was evenly matched throughout the first half, but the powerful Cougars pulled to a 43-32 lead at the third quarter mark and coasted from there. Lassen led at the first period post 11-10 but the score was knotted at the half, 27-27.

Center Bret Johnson topped the losers with 14 tallies while teammate Bob Allison followed with 12.

"The kids look real good. They scored very well," said Shipman following the game. "We're going to be real tough from here on out."

The next action for the Cougars is the Southern Siskiyou Holiday Tournament on their home court this coming Friday and Saturday. The classic opens Friday at 7 p.m. when Dunsmuir at McCloud tangle, while in the second contest Weed will be pitted against Mount Shasta.

The following night the losers will clash for consolation honors in the 7 o'clock game while the Friday winners meet in the 8:30 test to decide the championship.
