

Shah Of Iran's Wife-To-Be Gets Final Trousseau Item

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Farah Diba, the 21-year-old former art student who becomes the bride of the Shah of Iran Monday, has received the final item in her trousseau — her Dior wedding gown.

She tried it on as soon as it arrived by plane from Paris Friday. The other dresses, coats and accessories that she selected on a recent Paris shopping spree were already in the Queen Mother's palace, where Farah is living temporarily. They fill about 60 pieces of luggage.

The wedding gown is a princess satin in a light bluish, pearl gray shade which designer Yves Matthew Saint Laurent selected for the bride. It has a veil to match and a cape-like bolero.

The setting for the wedding will

be the Hall of Mirrors in the Marble Palace, where last week Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi entertained President Eisenhower with a lavish luncheon.

Members of the Shah's family, Farah's family, high state dignitaries and a select number of guests will witness the ceremony.

Student Council members learned of the civil defense program planned for KU from Wendell Smith of the Civil Defense Committee during a regular Thursday meeting after school December 17 in Room 328N.

Mr. Smith outlined this plan to council so that they could give the students, whom they are representing, an idea of what is coming. The complete evacuation plans will soon be sent to the parents with accompanying information sheet to be filled out by students and signed by parents so that the necessary information to complete details will be obtained.

"According to present civil defense plans, schools will receive notice of an alert at least 15 minutes before a general warning is broadcast, and students who live within 15 minutes' walking distance of KU (nine blocks) and who do not normally have cars at school, will be dismissed immediately, to walk home before the general alert is sounded. All other students — those who keep cars at school and those without transportation who live more than nine blocks from the school — will be evacuated directly from the school by bus or automobile," the committee report read.

"Evacuation routes for the high school will be north on Highway 97 either via Esplanade and Kit Carson Way or via North Eleventh Street, Oregon Avenue, and Biehn Street. After the general alert is sounded, it will be impractical for either pedestrians or cars to cross these evacuation routes to get to or from the high school. Parents, therefore, should not attempt to drive to school in order to pick up their children after the general alert is sounded.

Buses, student and faculty cars, plus additional transportation which will be furnished if necessary by the Civil Defense Transportation Service, should allow us to evacuate all remaining students before parents could reach the school after a general alert," the report concluded.

Also, special guest, Ann Jendrzejewski of Sacred Heart Academy, delivered her speech on "I speak for Democracy" to the body in a timely message concerning democracy as seen by a gavel. Included in her speech was the gavel's description of a high school student council in operation.

Under old business, the representatives received final information on the Christmas wreaths, which are to be put on their doors Monday. There is no limitation on the wreaths except that they pertain to Christmas. A \$5 prize will be awarded to the winning wreath.

The council also heard a report by Ann Anderson representing the Assembly Committee. She related that the entire student body will go to a special Christmas assembly Wednesday.

Before closing, the members heard some suggestions, including that of a cleanup committee, of buying a motion picture camera, and the seating in Pelican Court for the basketball games. All this will be brought up next week for more complete discussion after the students have their say in first period.

Other news: The student body Christmas tree is up in the cafeteria with all its splendor of shining decorations supplied by the various clubs and organizations.
