Labor Council Raps Paper

PORTLAND (AP) — A recent ruling that the struck Oregonian and Oregon Journal were faced with an emergency and were permitted to work women more than the lawful 44-hour weekly maximum drew a sharp rebuke Monday night.

The Multnomah County Central Labor Council adopted a resolution of censure against the state Bureau of Labor.

The state Wage and Hour Commission ruled an emergency existed and held the publishers could work the women 60 hours a week through last Saturday.

Dean Mickels of the State, County and Municipal Employees Union moved that a letter of criticism be sent to Labor Commissioner Norman Nilsen.

The motion drew a second from Gordon Swope of the Retail Clerks Union and a member of the state Wage and Hour Commission. Swope was the only one of the three members on the commission to oppose the ruling.

The strike started when stereotypers at The Oregonian and The Oregon Journal walked off the job Nov. 10. Other union employees observed picket lines. The newspapers immediately started publishing a joint edition, which continues.
