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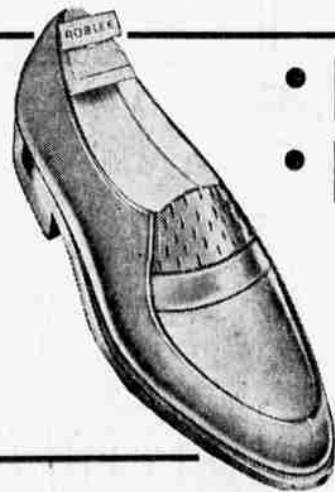


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HOME EXTENSION

Also during the session members voted to contribute money to the community toy drive.

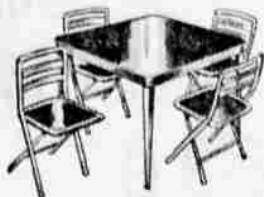
