Tax Evaders Get Warning

WASHINGTON (UPD) — The Justice Department plans to get tougher with income tax evaders and others who try to chisel the federal government. Assistant Attorney General Charles K. Rice, chief of the department's tax division, said Sunday night in a year-end report to Attorney General William P. Rogers that income tax cheats are costing the Treasury large amounts in revenue. Rice said his division was setting up a program for cracking down on persons who claim false dependency exemptions and in a "substantial number" of cases involving "wilful omission" of dividend and interest income from tax returns. The "great majority" of convictions last year involved tax chiselers "in business, professional and employ groups who had never before been in any trouble with the law." Rice said. There also was a continuing crackdown, he added, on gangsters and labor racketeers.
