Today's Sport Parade 'The Stilt' Develops 'Finger Roll' Weapon

NEW YORK (UPI) — Wilt Chamberlain is developing a new "finger roll" shot today which seems sure to break the 29.2 average and total of 2,105 points set last season by Bob Pettit of the St. Louis Hawks.

Apparently he is equally certain of new rebounding marks. Bill Russell created the prevailing standards last season with 1,612 for a 23.5 average.

Wilt at the halfway mark has 1,041 and a 23.1 average.

If Chamberlain comes even close to doubling his figures in the remaining half of the season he will make all four former records appear insignificant.
