

# Spud Figures Show Decline

USDA's January 1 potato stocks estimate of 97.5 million cwt. released Friday afternoon compares with 117.7 million a month ago. USDA's revised figure for January 1 stocks a year ago is 108.3 million.

Disappearance in January of 20.2 million cwt. is the second highest disappearance for that month in the last 10 years.

Disappearance for the three-month period of December, January and February for years since the 1953 crop, excluding 1955, with heavy government diversion, has ranged from 51 to 59 million cwt. or a range of 17 to 19 2-3 million per month.

County Agent Walt Jendrzewski reports that a 60 million cwt. disappearance for the December 1-March 1 period this season would result in March 1 stocks of 57 to 58 million. March 1 stocks last season were reported as 58 million.

January 1 stocks in Idaho given as 22 1/2 million compare to 24 1/2 million a year ago and to 27 million last month.

Idaho rail shipment at 19,661 cars on January 12 is 4,055 cars behind a year ago. Processing is reported at a record rate. National rail shipments at 94,326 are 3,782 cars greater than a year ago.

Idaho's crop estimate of 38 million cwt. is 3 1/2 million cwt. less than a year ago.

Winterringer attempted to swerve back to the right side of the road but was caught in a sideswipe accident before Chaplin's car went into a borrow pit. Police said Winterringer was cited for having an improper tail light and Chaplin was cited for following too closely.

There were no injuries reported among the two drivers and seven passengers, one in the Chaplin car and six in the Winterringer car.
