

# Nelson Not A Candidate, But Will Be On Ballot

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) — Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York insists he's not a candidate for the Republican presidential nomination but his name will appear at least three times on the ballot.

Sen. Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota is running for the Democratic nomination but the chances are his name won't be seen anywhere on the ballot.

Those examples demonstrate two seeming inconsistencies of this state's first-in-the-nation presidential primary March 8.

Every presidential election year the rest of the nation looks first to New Hampshire for possible straws in the political winds. And the country often gets a little confused about the complicated mechanics of this state's early-bird primary.

There are actually two separate primaries — one for Republican voters and the other for Democrats. Each ballot has two separate sections.

One section is called a preference poll. This gives the voter a chance to register a direct choice from among the announced presidential contenders — or anyone else. In addition to the names of avowed candidates, there is a blank space where the voters can write in the names of others.

The other section is a separate contest for seats at the Republican and Democratic national conventions. The delegate candidates can be firmly committed to a presidential hopeful, just "favorable" to him or free agents.

Let's look first at the preference poll which has won most of the attention in previous years.

It's actually a popularity contest but the results aren't binding on the delegates elected in the other part of the ballot. When the voter picks up his ballot he finds in the upper right-hand corner this statement: "I hereby declare my preference for candidate for the office of President of the United States to be as follows:"

Under this will appear the names of all presidential hopefuls who have been entered in the preference poll and who have not taken advantage of their option to withdraw.

When a presidential candidate's name is filed for this contest, he is immediately notified that he has ten days in which to bow out. If the candidate doesn't ask that

his name be stricken it will be printed on the ballot.

Humphrey's name will not appear in the Democratic popularity contest. He won't permit it. The Minnesota senator doesn't wish to challenge Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass) in a state where Kennedy is considered the overwhelming Democratic favorite.

The withdrawal option is the reason that Vice President Richard M. Nixon is thus far the only contender in the Republican presidential beauty contest. Gov. Rockefeller has said that if anyone enters his name he will immediately remove it.

In the other section of the primary—the battle for seats at the conventions — the ground rules are quite different.

If a person wants to be a convention delegate, he can enter the lists under one of three designations — pledged, favorable or uncommitted. The ballot spells out exactly how each delegate candidate is running.

A person who wants to be pledged—that means he is bound to vote for his presidential choice as long as his name is before the convention—must obtain specific permission from his choice.

If you want to run as favorable to anyone, you don't need his permission.

## Lad Pleads For Father

WASHINGTON (AP) — "Don't send my Daddy and Mom to jail," pleaded nine-year-old Jim, a rheumatic fever shut-in. "I will go to jail for them."

This written appeal was directed to President Eisenhower recently by a Midwestern youngster who feared his parents would be jailed as income tax cheats.

The boy had a special reason for offering to serve any jail term that might be required. To occupy his idle hours, he had juggled the figures in his father's account books, much to the dismay of tax agents.

"Will you help me?" Jim wrote the President. "I'm in a lot of trouble. I was fixing my books and I changed the prices and dates on the receipts. (sic) . . . I'm not a delinquent, (sic) I don't steal or bust windows. But don't send my daddy and mom to jail. I will go to jail for them. I'll be old when I get out and my Mom and Dad will be old, but I'll never do anything like that again. "Can I learn to be a doctor or a scientist (sic) if I go to jail?" I pray ever nice you will forgive me."

The White House sent the letter to the Internal Revenue Service, which dispatched an "understanding agent" to call on Jim and assure him no one will be jailed.

IRS, disclosing the incident today, would not say where Jim lives because it cannot identify people who have tax difficulties.
