ETNA—Atlanta Adams was hostess recently to the Etna Woman's Club first meeting of the year when 25 members were present.

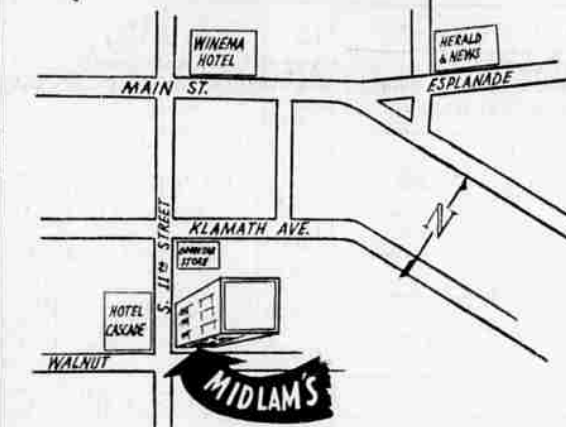
