Commercial bakeries were in existence as early as the 6th Century, B.C. Students representing 25 foreign countries are enrolled at Notre Dame University.

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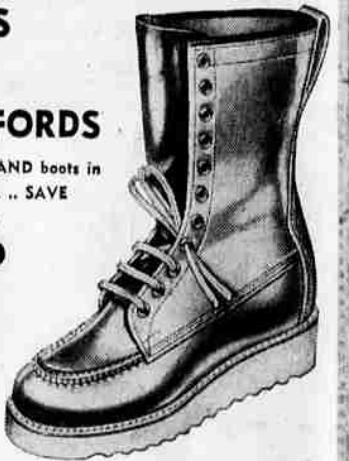
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GUILD CARD PARTY
