



**REFRESHING IS THE WORD** — A delightful complement to any family room is a refreshment bar. Handy for snacks and soft drinks, it makes impromptu entertaining a snap. Cabinets for glassware and non-perishable foodstuffs can be executed in golden-beige Douglas fir. Sink for quick wash-ups should be included in the plan and a pint sized refrigerator if possible.

## Refreshment Bar Proves Hit In Almost Any Home

Smash hit of any party or family room is the refreshment bar.

In modern America where the holiday season extends over 12 months and entertaining is apt to consist of a "drop over" invitation, the refreshment bar proves a real boon to the host who likes to relax and enjoy his own party.

Adding a refreshment bar to a family room isn't much of a project. They can be of very simple design, and will take little space from the room. In fact, they make good use of wasted space in odd corners, wall areas between windows, or other "unusable" niches.

A really serviceable refreshment bar is made up of several components. The bar counter itself, of course, is the most important. This is used not only for sip 'n' snack time, but also can play an important role as a buffet table for informal spreads, such as bridge party desserts.

One very simple, but effective, bar design calls for straight sides which are slanted inward ever so slightly towards the bottom. Edge-glued panels of tough, but beautiful, Douglas fir are a favorite for this type of styling, for the edge-glued material gives a sleek, sophisticated appearance. Finishing the wood with a clear plastic lacquer provides plenty of protection while displaying the golden beige coloring and elegant, straight graining of Douglas fir.

Edge-glued fir also makes a distinctive, heavy-duty countertop. It should be finished with long wearing, heavy duty spar varnish or one of the new finishes which resist cigarette burns, moisture rings, and scorching from hot dishes.

Success of the refreshment bar will depend on what's underneath the counter, too. Definitely, under-counter storage units should be included for supplies of non-perishable foodstuffs, cocktail napkins, and the like. If possible, a pint-sized refrigerator and sink for quick wash-ups should be included.

Paneling of Douglas fir to match the bar itself makes an attractive backdrop. On this, open shelving can be mounted for glassware. Another idea would be to design the backdrop in handsome, closed cabinets, similar to kitchen cabinets, for added storage.

Choice of bar stools puts the

final, personal touch to the refreshment bar.

## Boy Is Sub War Expert

MUSKEGON, Mich. (UPI)—The U.S. Navy is keeping its eye on 10-year-old Terry Gardner of Muskegon.

The fifth-grader has his own ideas about submarine warfare and the Navy thinks they're pretty good.

Terry recently submitted to President Eisenhower his theory on an underwater bomb capable of being launched from a submarine. The boy included sketches of his plan.

The President forwarded Terry's brochure to the Office of Naval Research, inventions evaluation branch. Division director Lysle M. Shields wrote back:

"The parts you describe are very necessary to provide the operation of submarine torpedoes. These are standard and functional devices with which all submarines used to attack other water craft are equipped.

"The Navy appreciates the interest you have taken in underwater armament. Furthermore, we hope you will apply your keen, inquiring mind to the mastery of the scientific principles needed to attain the new achievements within your reach!"

## Bridge May Be Really Golden

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — The Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco may have its color changed — to golden.

The bridge is presently orange, but James Adam, its manager, has agreed to test a new paint for its resistance to sun and fog damage.

In 1937, when the Golden Gate Bridge was built, no gold paints were able to withstand corrosive elements. But now, Charles B. Cole of Harmon Colors says the pigment has been used successfully on automobiles and could be used on a bridge.

## Pharmacy Seminars To Be Slated

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Plans for a statewide series of pharmacy seminars, designed to give Oregon's 1,300 practicing pharmacists current information on new products and practices, have been announced by the Oregon State College school of pharmacy.

Seminars will be held in 12 areas of the state, according to Dr. Charles O. Wilson, new pharmacy school dean. Information meetings will be held at six of the locations each year, in addition to an annual seminar which will be rotated between Portland and Corvallis.

The first seminar will be before the Marion-Polk Pharmaceutical Association in Salem next month. A second meeting has been planned for the Lane County Pharmaceutical Association in Eugene and three additional seminars will be held in other areas before June, Dean Wilson said.

Herman C. Forslund, professor of pharmacy, will direct the program. All pharmacy staff members will participate in presenting the special reports.

"The need for a program of continued education in pharmacy is great," Dean Wilson noted. "Advancements in medicine have been tremendous during the past decade and even greater progress is seen during the next few years. New products currently are being introduced at the rate of one a day."

"The pharmacist must be an expert on these new and complex agents — antibiotics, steroids, geriatric preparations, vaccines, anti-cancer drugs, etc. — and serve as a consultant to physicians," Dean Wilson added.

The seminars will serve to keep pharmacists abreast of new products and also present new trends in business aspects of drug store management, including new techniques in inventory control and marketing, he explained.

## 24 Members Added To UN

NEW YORK (UPI)—The United Nations added 24 countries to its membership rolls during the 1950's, from 58 nations in 1950 to 82 today.

In the past decade two of the Axis powers of World War II, Japan and Italy, became U.N. members. The world organization also enrolled the Soviet satellites of Hungary, Rumania and Bulgaria, and admitted Spain and Portugal.

The decline of colonialism in Africa and Asia is reflected in the list of new U.N. members. It includes the newly-independent states of Malaya, Laos, Indonesia, Cambodia, Ghana, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia, Sudan and the Republic of Guinea.

The first printing of Charles Darwin's controversial "On the Origin of Species" sold out its 1,250 copies on the first day.
