Ocean Probe Sets Record

SAN DIEGO (UPI) — The record-setting bathyscaphe Trieste will make another seven-mile dive in the Marianas Trench off the island of Guam sometime this week.

Dr. Franz N. D. Kurie, Naval Electronics Laboratories technical director, made the announcement Sunday on his return from Guam. The Trieste set a world record depth of 37,800 feet in the Pacific Saturday.

"The next dive will concentrate as much as possible on obtaining purely scientific data," said Kurie. He said Saturday's dive was a test of the structure of the blimp-like craft.

"The Trieste has proved we can obtain information from great depths on temperature, salinity, water currents, marine life, bottom geology, and other factors applicable to scientific and naval problems," Kurie said.

Dr. Andreas Rechnitzer, scientific director of the expedition, was expected to make the deep dive with Lt. Don Walsh, who is the Navy officer in charge.

Walsh made last Saturday's historic dive with Jacques Piccard, Swiss scientist and designer of the Trieste.

Kurie said the Trieste will be shipped back to San Diego before the typhoon season starts in the Guam area in March. The craft will continue its research dives off the California coast.

LONDON (UPI) — Soviet scientists have discovered a new drug which "completely cures the paralysis caused by polio." Radio Moscow said Sunday. The broadcast said the drug, known as Karantonin, was processed from a perennial herb found growing in central Asia.

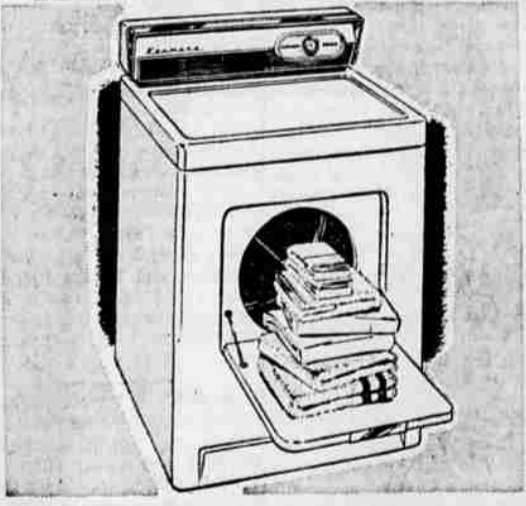
