But, from either a statistical or an actual standpoint, neither Oregon Tech nor Eastern Oregon has a guarantee that their assignments will be easy.

Bounce-Ball Tennis Asks Fan Okay

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Promoter Jack Kramer brought his pitty-pat pros to Los Angeles' big new Sports Arena today, hoping to win public approval of his bounce-ball tennis.

Alex Olmedo, who fell from the pinnacle of amateur tennis in 1958 to a Davis Cup coat last year, made his U.S. pro debut in San Francisco Thursday night with a 6-4, 6-2 bounce-ball triumph over Tony Trabert.

Bounce-ball prohibits volleying until after each player has made at least one return after service. It is being used only in the opening singles match each evening of the 37-night American tour.

So Richard (Pancho) Gonzales, with no restrictions on his power, had no difficulty stopping little Ken Rosewall in the later feature match. The scores were 6-4, 6-4 as 6-foot-3 1/2 Pancho's killer serve and sharp volleys more than counteracted the 5-foot-7 Australian's finesse.

In doubles—where bounce-ball is out of the question because of the difference in the game—Gonzales and Rosewall easily disposed of Trabert and Pancho Segura 6-4, 6-1, while Olmedo sped to an airplane and back to the University of Southern California for a final exam.

Bounce-ball gives the server the first opportunity to volley—hit the ball on the fly—as in normal tennis. It but it delays any such smashing. It robs a player like Gonzales of the initial big blow—a lightning serve followed by a rush to the net for a quick-kill volley. An ace serve is still an ace, however.

Kramer said "zing-zing (slam-bang) tennis pleases the expert. I love it. But too many fans protested that after you'd seen one pro match, you'd seen them all because there were too many quick-kill points; too few rallies."

Crowd reaction varied, but amateur officials generally liked what they have had for many decades. "Would you penalize a fighter because he has a knockout punch?" demanded James Moffet, chairman of the Davis Cup Selection Committee of the U.S. Lawn Tennis Assn.

"If (bounce-ball) never, never will be adopted for amateur tennis."

High Quinn, nationally known umpire said, "It gives a player a chance to show off his ground strokes."

Stan Smith, umpire and Olympic Club tennis commissioner commented, "They can't play their regular game. Trabert couldn't use his big serve."

pass the 100 mark for conference scoring. Jones, this week, hit his 100th point in five OCC contests, for an average of 21.0 per game. While Jones was climbing into the number one spot, Eastern Oregon's Frank Chase and Pasco Artiola slipped into second and third respectively with 15.8 and 15.3 averages. OCE's Dennis Spencer, with 72 points and a 14.4 average is fourth.

With six games under his belt, Oregon Tech's Dennis McKee, with 75 points and a 12.5 mark, is fifth, just ahead of OCE's Dave Boyle and Southern Oregon's two-handed artist, Gordie Carrigan.

Although Portland State hasn't a man among the first seven scorers, it leads the entire conference defensively. Its assorted foe have scored at a miserly 48.2 clip. Offensively Portland State is on the bottom, having counted a 45.5 average per game. However, from the important win-loss standpoint, they are still number one and the team to beat.

In the free throw department McKee heads the conference list with 24 for 30 and an .800 mark. SOC's Brad Flannery is second and PSC's Jack Bertell and Dennis Heath are third and fourth while Owl Norm Oliva is fifth.

OCE's Al Harter, a 6-9 freshman from North Salem, is the top rebounder in the conference and Southern Oregon's John Payne is second while OTT's Paul Layher is next.

Southern Oregon, 4-4 in league play, must stand idly by this weekend while Oregon Tech and Eastern Oregon take their shots at the number one spot.

The Owls, who will again follow the "unit" system, must floor one squad tonight and Saturday short the services of Buddy Gull, who received a badly sprained ankle in the SOC-OTT clash Tuesday. Coach Wally Palmberg will start Norm Oliva, Paul Layher, Gene Branson, Dennis McKee and Leon Wilson. Standing in ready relief are his second five starters, Troy Koontz, Jack Horton, Roy Johnson, Van Zitek and Jim Ramseyer, who will take over for Gull. Ramseyer, himself, has just gotten over a sprained ankle.

Starters for the OCE Wolves will include Ron Jones, Dave Doyle, Dennis Spencer, Ron Jolima and Harter.

DETROIT (AP) — The folks in Victorville, Que., will be happy to know that Jean Beliveau is bringing home another souvenir for his trophy.

Back in 1956, townspeople gave the Montreal Canadian player a huge trophy, big enough for a dozen or so pucks to commemorate outstanding dates in his hockey career.

Beliveau's winning goal in Thursday night's 4-2 triumph over the Detroit Red Wings was the 500th point of his National Hockey League career, which began seven seasons ago. It came early in the final period, after the 28-year-old star had assisted on an earlier goal to run his league-leading point total to 64.

This will be the sixth puck added to the trophy. Others mark his first goal, his 100th, etc.

Henri (Pocket Rocket) Richard shared the limelight with Beliveau in the victory. He popped in a pair of goals, pulling his club into a tie with a goal in the last six seconds of the middle period, then added an insurance tally in the final four minutes of the game.
