Theft Charge Dismissed

A car theft charge against a transient was dismissed in district court Wednesday on information from the FBI that the man knew nothing of the theft. George Lee Killis, 30, had been charged with stealing a jeep station wagon from Ward's Klamath Funeral Home January 21. Killis and a 14-year-old boy from Klamath Falls were arrested in Nevada City, California, and there the boy admitted he had stolen the vehicle. He told California authorities the key was in the station wagon.

Apparently he had given Killis a ride later on his way to California. The district attorney's office said the theft case now is being investigated by the FBI. The juvenile office here had not yet been asked to enter the case. Another dismissal in district court concerned Robert Miller, 37, 1915 Orchard Avenue, charged by his wife with assault and battery on Christmas Eve. The couple settled their differences out of court, the district attorney's office said.

Presbyterian Meeting

TULELAKE—The Presbytery of southwest Oregon, ministers and ruling elders representing the 28 Presbyterian churches of Southern Oregon, will meet at the newly completed Westminster Presbyterian Church in Medford on Friday, February 5. Herd Law Battle Goes On Ballot

The petitions propose the question of a herd law for the district. If a herd law is in effect, the livestock owner is responsible for damages if an animal is hit by a car; if the herd law is not in effect, the driver is responsible.
