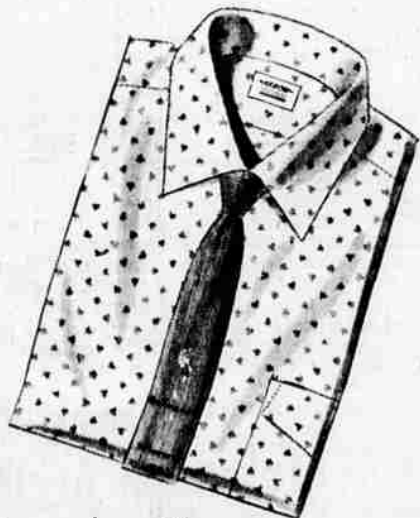

Woman Saved By Firemen

GRAND JUNCTION, Colo. (AP)—A 74-year-old widow lay paralyzed in a bathtub for 35 hours before rescue came Wednesday night.

Eleanor Strachan was taken to St. Mary's Hospital in serious condition. Doctors said she apparently suffered a stroke.

A visiting grandson alarmed by her failure to answer the door kicked out a window and discovered Mrs. Strachan. He called firemen.

Mrs. Strachan said she had been in the tub since 9 a.m. Tuesday. Her bathroom was kept warm by a portable electric heater she had taken there with her. She apparently was unconscious part of the time.

"I tried calling over and over," she said, "but I couldn't yell very loud. More than anything else, I prayed."

Fiery Flow Continuing

KAPOHO VILLAGE, Hawaii (AP)—A steaming, hissing river of lava continued on its slow but devastating way today, destroying everything in its path.

Six fashionable weekend houses were burned Wednesday along the Hawaii Island shoreline.

The fiery flow was more than two miles from Kapoho Village, now but a burned-out shell. Kilauea volcano, meanwhile, was still erupting, sending molten lava streaming from three vents. The continuous outpour shoved the lava further and further along, rolling along the coast in shallow water until it found an exposed area along the beach.

The lava stream, extending as far as half a mile offshore in places, produced water disturbances and an eerie steam.

BANDIT LOSES

LONDON (UPI)—A bandit gave up his robbery plans when the woman behind the tobacco store counter told him all the store's cash had been sent to the bank.

But he needed small change, so he took out a five pound note—worth \$14—and asked her to change it for him. The woman cried out and the bandit ran—leaving his five pound note behind.

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Police Exams Set Feb. 20

The city police rookie waiting list is exhausted, so the force will offer another qualifying examination February 20.

Applications must be in the hands of police no later than February 13. Applicants are to meet at the city library at 9 a.m.

The examination consists of a preliminary physical ability test, then an oral interview, and, finally, a two-hour written examination. Those who pass must take physical exams.

A man will be hired and put on patrolman status as soon as test results are evaluated. The man who makes the best score will be selected. Others will be put on a waiting list and will be hired, top scorers first, as they are needed.

Patrolmen start at \$355 per month and may rise to a maximum \$390 per month patrolman salary within two years. Additional salary raises are doled as rank rises.

The city furnishes uniforms. Patrolmen must purchase their own .38 caliber revolvers.

No man with a criminal record will be hired, nor will those with records of more than minor misdemeanors.
