

Ike Message May Ask Aid For Allies

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower probably will send Congress a special message later this session asking authority to supply some U.S. allies with atomic weapons.

A final administration decision on taking this step has yet to be made. It may be influenced by congressional reaction to the idea of sharing the weapons as well as by the impact on world opinion.

Present law permits limited sharing of some types of nuclear information, but requires that this country keep full control of nuclear weapons it produces.

Distribution of atomic weapons to nations which do not have them has long been a controversial issue. The present atomic powers are the United States, Britain and the Soviet Union. France has been reported at the point of exploding its first atomic test device.

The President told a news conference Wednesday that he had always believed "that we should not deny to our allies what the enemies, what your potential enemy already has."

"We do want allies to be treated as partners and allies, and not as junior members of a firm who are to be seen but not heard."

"So I would think that it would be better, for the interests of the United States, to make our law more legal."

Later his press secretary, James C. Hagerty, indicated the administration was actively exploring the desirability of seeking amendment to the present law.

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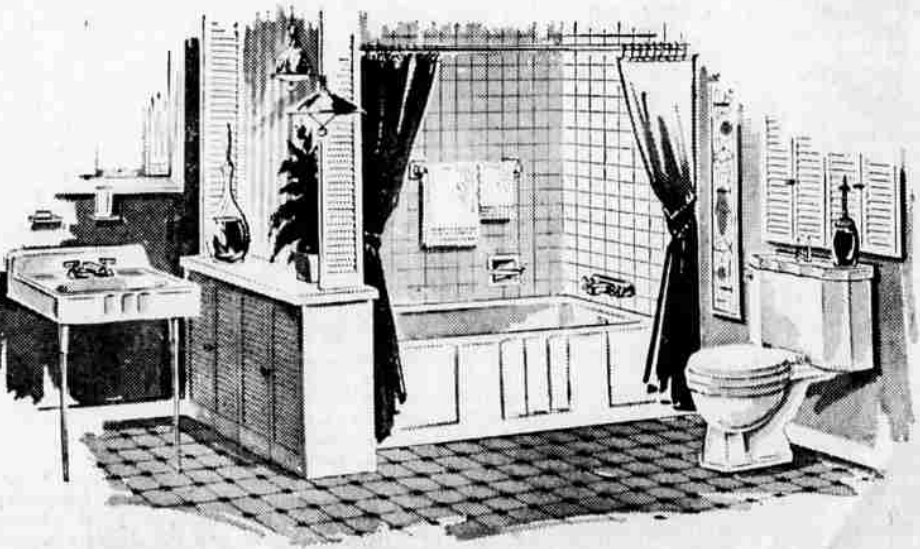
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Collision Due In Primaries

WASHINGTON (AP)—A double-header collision in two state primaries on the same day appeared to be in the making today between Sens. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass) and Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.).

Both arranged to enter their names today in West Virginia's May 10 presidential popularity contest. Kennedy called a news conference here and Humphrey sent an aide to Charleston, W.Va., with filing papers.

At the same time, Humphrey said he is giving serious thought to filing in the May 10 Nebraska primary, which Kennedy already has announced he will enter.

"The reports from Nebraska are good and I am seriously considering entering there," Humphrey told a reporter. "I will decide definitely before the middle of the month."

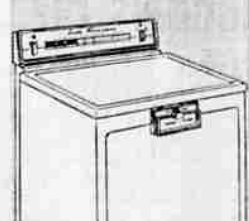

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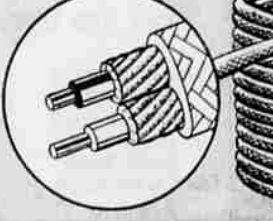
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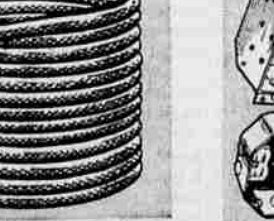


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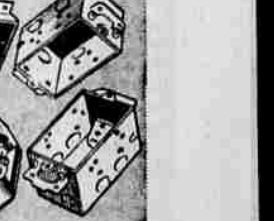


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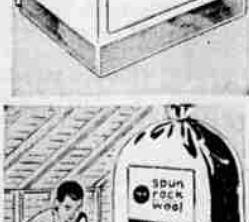
Attractive ceiling fixture has simulated out white glass shade. Plated canopy and shade bracket. See Sears.



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
