Experts Sure Of Victory Over Lamprey

OTTAWA (AP)—Canadian and U.S. scientists feel confident they are winning their battle against the sea lamprey that has been killing off the trout in Lake Superior. For four years the scientists have been teaming up in a crash program to exterminate Lake Superior's lamprey colony and preserve the trout's last refuge in the five Great Lakes. Using underwater electric shocks and a powerful spawning ground poison, they have killed millions of the ugly bloodsuckers and now appear to have the upper hand. Ontario, Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota are cooperating in the restocking of the lake with hatchery-reared trout yearlings, about 700,000 of them last year.

The scientists of the Great Lakes Fisheries Commission plan this year to use their techniques in lakes Huron and Michigan, where huge trout colonies were wiped out several years ago. They will also try them out in Georgian Bay, where the lampreys have virtually finished the trout population.

The lamprey, a primitive, eel-like fish, has been in the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario for centuries. Measuring 1 to 2 feet, it kills by fastening itself to a fish by the pointed teeth lining its circular mouth. The opening of the Welland Canal in 1829 enabled the fast-swimming killers to bypass Niagara Falls. Because they prefer cold water, it took them 100 years to migrate across warm, shallow Lake Erie.

Gatun Lake, which is 85 feet above sea level in the north portion of the Panama Canal Zone, has an area of 164 square miles.

Negro Minister Eyed For Post

NEW YORK (AP)—A Negro minister has been nominated for the highest elective office in the United Presbyterian Church. The Presbytery of New York Monday nominated the Rev. Adler G. Hawkins for the post of moderator of the 62 churches in the New York Presbytery.

He will be a candidate at the church's General Assembly May 18 in Cleveland, Ohio. If elected, he would be the first Negro to achieve such eminence in a predominantly white church organization. The United Presbyterians' three million members live mostly outside the Southern states.

Bolivia Elections; Civil War Likely

LA PAZ, Bolivia (AP)—Bolivia's presidential campaign, already marred by almost three dozen violent deaths, including a lynching, could explode into civil war. Two men—bitter political and personal enemies—are engaged in a desperate struggle for the presidency of this landlocked South American nation. They are Victor Paz Estenssoro, president from 1952 to 1956, and Walter Guevara Arze, now foreign minister in President Hernan Siles Zuazo's cabinet.

Officer Urges Spy Satellite

WASHINGTON (AP)—Air Force experts held out hope today that military satellites of the "spy in the sky" type may help discourage possible surprise missile attacks by the Soviet Union. Lt. Gen. Bernard A. Schriever, chief of Air Force research, urged top priority for development of early warning, reconnaissance and communications satellites. They are now practical, using "existing hardware and technology," he said, adding: "They have a great potential for national security."

Schriever and Gen. Thomas S. Power of the Strategic Air Command testified publicly Tuesday before the Senate Space and Preparedness committees. They returned today, along with Gen. Thomas D. White, Air Force chief of staff, for closed-door testimony. Both Schriever and Power agreed that during the next few years the Soviet Union would have enough long-range missiles to stage a surprise attack upon this country.
