"We didn't order the magazines," he said, "and we didn't want to get ourselves into a controversy."

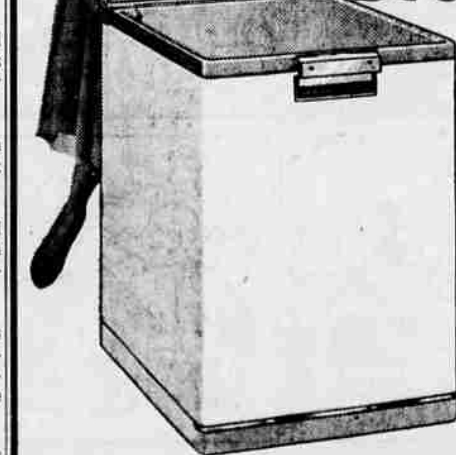
But after thinking it over, he had them put back on the stand, as did others elsewhere in town.

The magazine was USSR, the one distributed in the United States by the Soviet Union under an agreement where the U.S., in return, distributes its own magazine, Amerika, in the Soviet Union.

And the USSR was sent to Boise Wednesday on the eve of a visit to southwestern Idaho by a group of Soviet officials on tour of America.

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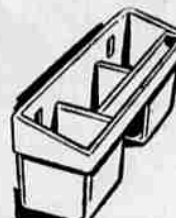
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
