Los Bums Pay Hiked Price

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The Los Angeles Dodgers disclosed Friday they have played ball with stubborn Chavez Ravine property owners and paid \$340,000 for land parcels formerly appraised at \$32,650.

Dodger publicist Arthur (Red) Patterson said the club agreed to pay the price for three pieces of property to expedite construction of the new 50,000 seat stadium.

He said the property was placed in escrow last week and that the Dodgers plan to pay another \$150,000 for nine more Chavez Ravine parcels needed for a recreational area to be built next to the stadium.

The deals included \$150,000 to Francis Scott for property appraised at \$9,000; \$130,000 to Franco B. De Leon for a store and residence valued at \$15,150 and \$60,000 to Charlotte Brown for a residence worth \$8,500.

Condemnation proceedings in 1953 fixed the appraisal figures.

A Dodger spokesman said the city had agreed to intervene and assist in the property negotiations when the club moved here and announced plans to finance its own stadium. But legal entanglements over acquisition of the properties caused long delays so the club decided to pay the prices.

Grading has been in progress for several months on the stadium site but has been hindered by the Scotts who refused to move from their centrally located home.

The estimated cost of the projected stadium, Dodger officials said, has now been boosted to 16 million dollars.

Oxford's Dawkins Fractures Jaw

LONDON (AP) — Pete Dawkins, Army football All-American of 1958 who became an Oxford rugby star, is in a hospital today with a fractured jaw sustained in an ice hockey game with Cambridge.

Dawkins, Rhodes scholar from Royal Oak, Mich., was the star of Friday night's game in which Oxford was noosed out 6-5.

The former cadet, who also played hockey at West Point, scored one goal and assisted in two others. Two minutes before the end of the game he body-checked a Cambridge player and went down in a tangle of skates and flashing sticks.
