### Flier Admits Flour Bombing

SACRAMENTO (UPI) — Air Force Lt. Robert Lee Azen, 21, has admitted dropping three five pound bags of flour Sunday upon some startled citizens in a Sacramento suburb.

Sheriff's deputies, who identified the navigational student at Mathier Air Force Base, said the lieutenant was aiming for an empty lot.

He told Deputy Clarence Martin that his friends were standing near the lot in Rancho Cordova to measure his accuracy. He was flying a single engine plane rented from a nearby airport.

But he hit the lot only once. The other two flour bags exploded on nearby rooftops, sending citizens to their phones to protest the unexpected attack.

### Heiress-Weds-Clerk Story Heads For Complications

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Troubles piled up today for a 17-year-old New York heiress who eloped with a delicatessen clerk last July.

Pretty Roberta Orr Brady of Southampton, L.I., faces a hearing on charges of stealing \$3,400 from her mother to finance her honeymoon with Albert Edward Brady, 26, an \$85-a-week clerk.

It developed her husband has been married once before—maybe twice—and is wanted in Houston, Tex., on an auto theft charge. He also is charged with abducting Roberta, who expects a child in three months.

"My sympathy goes out to her," said Brady's previous wife, the former Anna Jewell Euresli of Houston. "I feel so sorry for her."

### Hatfield Hits Welfare Ideas

YAKIMA (AP) — This country is threatened with moral decay, Gov. Mark Hatfield of Oregon said here, because of two false concepts.

He told a Republican dinner audience of 600 Saturday night that the concept of something for nothing undermines ambition. And the concept that in politics the end justifies the means is equally false, he said, and damaging.

He said the idea of getting something for nothing tied in with welfare. There has been an attitude that welfare programs are sacred and can not be attacked.

### Solons Pursue Payola Probe

WASHINGTON (UPI) — House investigators reported today they have turned up some "cut and dried" cases where record companies paid disc jockeys to spin their songs.

A source close to the payola investigating subcommittee said these instances would be aired this week when the hearings turn from the disc jockeys to representatives of record distributors.

The subcommittee was slated to open the second week of its hearings on alleged under-the-table payments to record-spinners with testimony from more Boston disc jockeys.

They were expected to testify, as did six present and former Boston and Cleveland radio station employees last week, that any money they got from record firms was not payola but represented fees for telling the companies which songs sounded like hits.

The subcommittee, which questioned a dozen witnesses last week, still has 25 to 30 more persons under subpoena for possible testimony on payola and other deceptive broadcasting practices.

Eventually, the questioning is likely to return to the subject of the lavish entertainment provided by the record industry at a Miami Beach convention of more than 2,000 disc jockeys last May.

### Neuberger Asks Anti-Smog Cars

WASHINGTON (AP) — There should be anti-smog devices on all cars, not just those sold in California, Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.) said Saturday.

Earlier, the Automobile Manufacturers Assn. said a crankcase device that reduces the amount of unburned hydrocarbons will be built into new models to be sold in California.

The device, said the association, will be available as optional equipment on 1961 models sold in the other 49 states.

Neuberger said the device should not be limited to cars sold in California, and in a statement said: "Experts estimate that the device could be included on a new car at a cost of less than \$1. While it may not be equally efficient in dealing with all types of smog, it appears to represent a reasonable precaution at little cost."

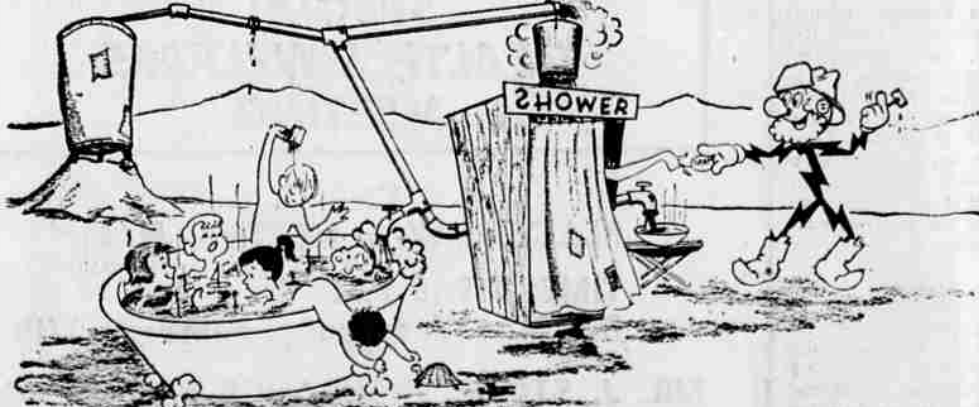
