

Lumber Plant Destroyed By Fire

PORTLAND (AP) — A fire burned through a four-story lumber plant here Wednesday night. Firemen said the building was a total loss, and damage was estimated at more than \$160,000.

The flames also ate into an adjoining cold storage company. Fire and water loss there was extensive.

Fire Inspector C. W. Stickney said determination of the fire's cause would have to await an extensive investigation.

The fire broke out about 7:30 p.m. in the frame building that housed the Western Door & Plywood Co. in Portland's Northwest industrial section.

It took firemen more than two hours to quell the flames.

The flames ate through nearly all of the top two floors of the building. Destroyed on those upper floors were large quantities of plywood, doors and cabinet stock.

The flames also swept through the bottom two floors, but they remained standing. The bottom floor had been filled with manufacturing equipment.

D. R. Morris, the secretary of the lumber firm, said he estimated the damage at more than \$160,000.

No estimate was available immediately on damage suffered by the adjoining Portland Ice & Cold Storage Co. J. W. Savinar, owner of the firm, said the building and equipment were valued at more than \$500,000—not counting contents of freezing units.

Nineteen pieces of equipment and scores of firemen fought the blaze.

3 Scheduled To Appear Before Jury

OREGON CITY (AP) — Three men held in connection with the dynamiting of six trucks in Oregon City that hauled for Portland's truck newspapers are scheduled to come before the Clackamas County Grand Jury today.

The three are Levi S. McDonald, 52, and two twin Snyder brothers, Edward and Charles, 23.

Dist. Atty. Winston Bradshaw said felony charges of injury to property by explosives will be presented against all three and a third degree arson charge also will be presented against McDonald.

The Snyder brothers admitted the dynamiting of the trucks at the Wymore Transfer Co. Jan. 31 and said McDonald paid them to do it, sheriff's deputies said. McDonald insists he is innocent.

McDonald is a member of the Stereotypers Union, which struck the Oregonian and Oregon Journal Nov. 10. Other union members observed the picket lines, but the newspapers have published jointly at the Oregonian plant, using non-union and supervisory personnel.

William Snyder, 19, brother of the other two, and Gerald Couzens, 20, were reported by Sheriff Francis Lambert of Multnomah County as admitting they set off blasts the same night that destroyed four trucks in Portland.

The three Snyders, Couzens and McDonald were indicted Saturday by a Multnomah County Grand Jury on charges of injury to property by explosives.
