### More Treatment Set For Flier

PORTLAND (AP) — Capt. Adam Tyra, 41, who walked away from the flaming crash of his jet fighter, was flown to Hamilton Air Force Base, Calif., for further treatment Wednesday.

Tyra's plane went down Jan. 28 on Davis Peak in Southwestern Washington. Though gravely injured, he walked away from the wreckage and was found the following day.

Tyra suffered burns, several fractures and other injuries in the crash. Before being flown out on a MATS plane Wednesday, he had been treated at an Air Force hospital here.

The World Day of Prayer has become an important day on the Christian calendar. It is probable that on this day, observed on the first Friday in Lent, more women of the whole family of God pray and work together than at any other time in the year. Prayers rise around the world in 60 languages and more than 1,000 dialects. The day begins in the Fiji Islands and ends on St. Lawrence Island in the Bering Sea. This is one Christian observance which penetrates behind the Iron Curtain.

Offerings, which are equally divided between home and foreign missions, aid agricultural workers in this country as well as Indian-Americans. Abroad, among other things the offerings help develop Christian leaders in the new African and Asian countries. This year the establishment of radio broadcasting stations in six countries in Africa is a significant addition to the list of accomplishments.

Mrs. James Evans, national director of the World Day of Prayer, says "Through these projects which our yearly observance makes possible, we demonstrate the unlimited power of prayer and the depth of our concern for God's children everywhere."

### Talk Slated By Clerics

The Reverend and Mrs. Albert C. Neubauer, former missionaries to Liberia, will present their mission show at Hope Lutheran Church, South Sixth Street at Homedale Road, Sunday night at 7:30. The program will include color movies, and a display of native costumes, and native songs. The public is invited to attend.

The Luther League is sponsoring this presentation as part of an emphasis on World Missions.

Liberia, the Lone Star Republic of Africa, located on the West Coast of Africa, was settled by repatriated slaves from America. In recent years the little Negro republic has made giant strides economically under the able direction of its president, William V. S. Tubman. The Lutheran Mission began work in that country in 1860.

The Rev. Neubauer served as a lay missionary and was appointed treasurer and business manager. In addition to his work among the offices and trading companies in Monrovia he made frequent trips into the tribal areas of the Kpelle and Loma people. He also served as lay pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Monrovia.

Mrs. Neubauer served as hostess of Mission House on the beach near Monrovia. In addition to directing the work of a staff of Liberian workers and caring for the needs of missionaries coming to the coast on business, she also assisted in the office and in the preparing of truck shipments of food and supplies to the five district mission stations to the "up country."

The Rev. Neubauer is presently pastor of Hope Lutheran Church. The family came to Klamath Falls last May from Blaine, Washington.

A coffee hour will follow the mission service.

### Solon Praises State Schools

LA GRANDE, Ore. (AP) — Oregon's schools are among the best in the nation today, but even the best today is not good enough to meet the challenge of tomorrow, state Sen. Monroe Sweetland (D-Milwaukie) said Tuesday.

Sweetland said a greater portion of public school support should be shifted from the local property taxpayers to the income and corporation excise taxpayer. Speaking before a Kiwanis luncheon, Sweetland urged immediate attention by the governor, the Tax Commission and the Legislative Interim Tax Committee to "the urgent revenue needs of Oregon's local taxing districts and the serious plight of some of Oregon's property taxpayers."

"The appetite of state and federal governments and the grotesque and unfair technique by which Oregon has distributed the obligation of financing public elementary and secondary education has literally starved local units of government such as schools, cities and counties at a time when public demand for their services has become most urgent," he added.
