An ordinance covering "close out" sales in the city of Klamath Falls was given its first two readings at the Tuesday night session of the city council.

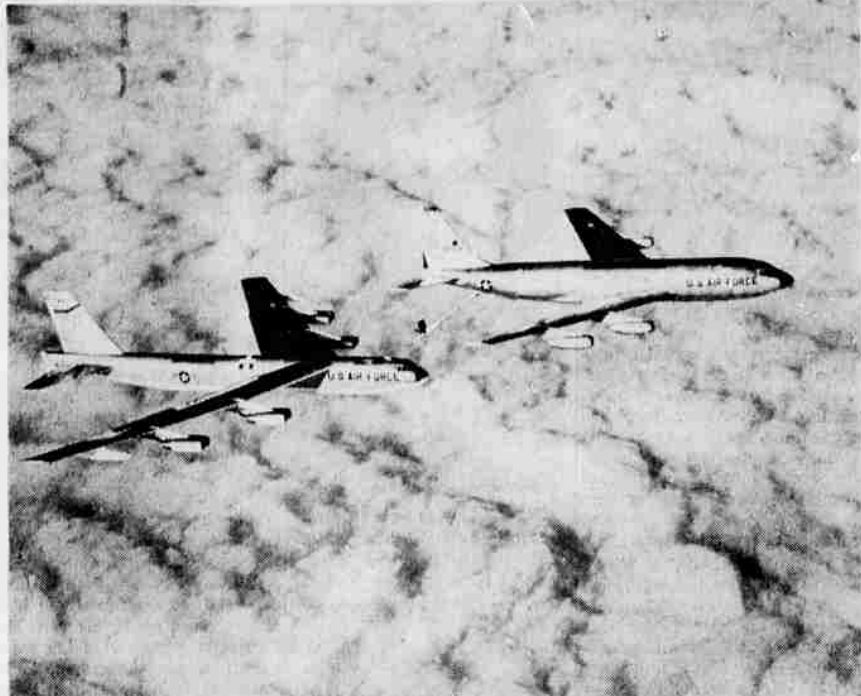
