Tougher Law Plea Issued

SALEM (AP) — The state traffic Safety Commission Wednesday asked again for tougher laws dealing with drunken driving, speeding and other traffic offenses.

It also renewed its proposal that Oregon have fixed speed limits in addition to the basic speed law.

The commission, consisting of state officials who deal with traffic problems, favored better use of chemical tests for those charged with drunken driving.

It asked for a law giving police the power to make arrests at the scene of accidents on probable cause.

The commission asked that all employees to use the seat belts state agencies require their when driving state cars.

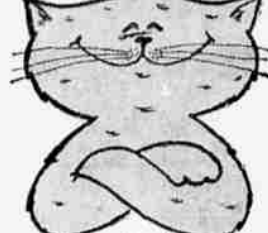
Waldo and Winnie are sand tiger sharks native to the Atlantic and have a mouthful of teeth and a triangular dorsal fin. Both are about four feet long.
