

GOP Treasurer Candidate To Visit Klamath Falls

Representative Shirley Field (Portland) a candidate for the Republican nomination for state treasurer, will visit Klamath Falls Saturday, March 19.

Miss Field will be the guest of Fred W. Heard of Klamath Falls. Heard is state chairman of the Oregon Republican College League and chairman of Representative Field's University of Oregon Campaign Committee.

Her visit to the Klamath Basin will be her initial campaign visit to this area. She is opposing State

Treasurer Howard Belton in the Republican primary.

Miss Field, a representative since 1957, is a member of the Labor and Industries, Public Health and Welfare, Education and Judiciary and Alcoholic Control committees of the Oregon House of Representatives. The state treasurer hopeful has been vice chairman of the Interim Education Committee. She had the endorsement of labor in her last campaign for state representative in Multnomah County. In May, 1959, she was invited to attend the White House Conference on Refugees in Washington, D.C.

Representative Field, a veteran of three sessions in the Oregon Legislature, represents the west subdistrict of Multnomah County. She is one of three lifetime Oregon Young Republicans. The other two are U.S. Maritime Commissioner Sig Unander and Tom Lawson McCall, prominent news analyst in Oregon.

The candidate for state treasurer, a in the Republican political circles for more than a de-

cade, has been an attorney for the past 13 years. She is a former board member of the League of Women Voters in Portland, a member of the governor's committees on Children and Youth, and on Prisons and Parole, and a member of the Izaak Walton League, the Urban League, and the American Association of University Women. She is a former member of the Executive Committee of the Young Republican National Federation.

Heard stated that a day of campaign activities is planned. A no-host dinner at the Winema Hotel at 6:30 p.m. is scheduled. Representative Field will give her main address of the Klamath Falls tour at that time. Heard mentioned that the tour is open to the public. 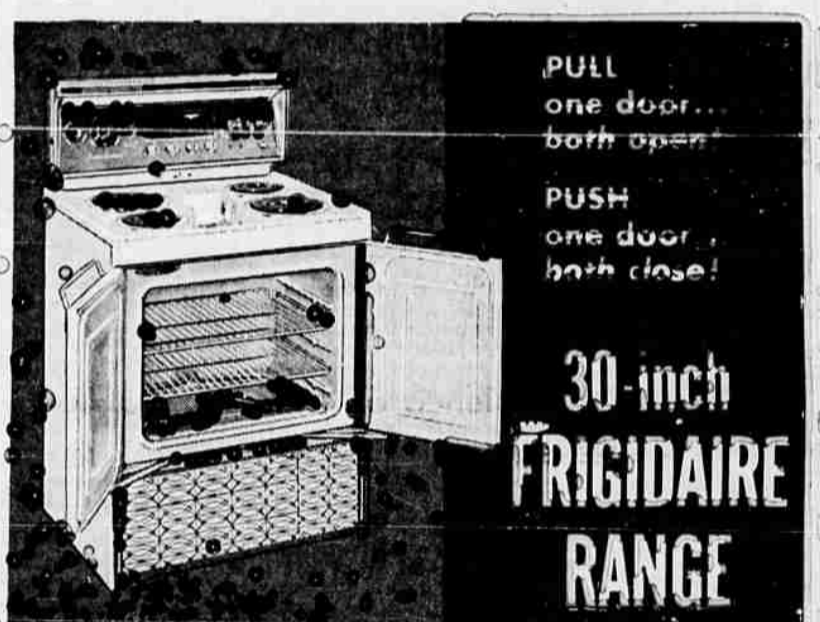

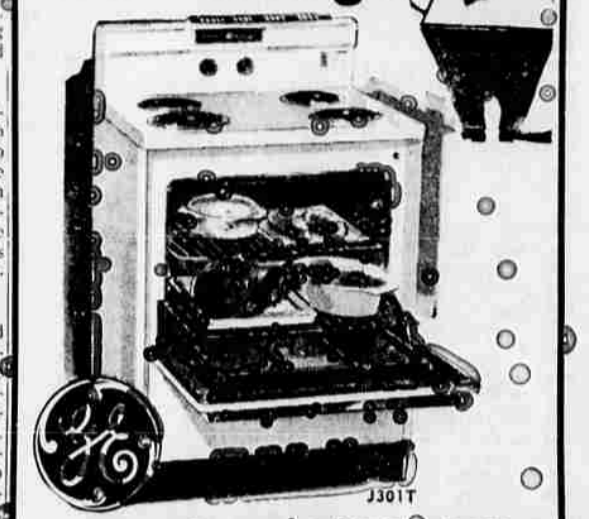
