Stocks WALL STREET NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market was irregular at the close today after motors touched off a rallying drive. Trading was fairly active. Volume for the day was estimated at 2,900,000 shares compared with 2,990,000 Monday. Leaders among pivotal stocks were from fractions to more than a point. Wider movements occurred among more speculative higher-priced issues. Minnesota Mining, recently a big gainer, dropped half a dozen points. International Business was bought in a series of large blocks and rose more than 1/2.
