

KU Groaners' Hopes High As 6 A-1 Tourney Nears

Klamath Union mat coaches DeLance Duncan and Mack Peterson called a halt this afternoon to preparations for the trip to Medford where the Pelican varsity will compete in the annual District 6 A-1 Wrestling Tournament on Hedrick Court Friday and Saturday.

Team hopes are rising as the tourney draws near with several members expected to gain berths for the coming state tournament March 11 and 12 at Oregon State's Coliseum.

Pelican Milo Crumrine seems a solid choice to win in the 98-pound bracket. The pick is based on his season record of 46 points, 24 wins and 10 losses.

Other Whitebelt tournament favorites who have better than adequate chances in obtaining an invitation to the state match are 141-pounder Dave Gonzales, 157-pounder Bill O'Neil, 163-pounder Art Mills and Joe Cox who grapples in the 178 weights.

Duncan said that KU would be better in the districts without any representatives in the 106 and 191-pound divisions. The Pels' best matman in the 106 weights is freshman Dave Vetkos who holds a seasonal record of one loss and one win. John Hancock in the 191 division seems a highly doubtful entry on account of an injury he is still recovering from.

Following Crumrine and Ross in total points for the year, Art Mills and Bill O'Neil have tallied 34 apiece. Next comes Gonzales with 25, Hancock with 22 and Trenton Douglas (130 pounds) with 20.

Larry Wishart who wrestles in the 141 weights has picked up 14. Sherd Duncan, 123-pounder, is the only grappler holding down a varsity position who hasn't pinned any of his opponents. Duncan has 10 points to his credit.

Mighty 'O' Nears Mark

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS. An 80-point burst in his last two games has just assured Cincinnati's great Oscar Robertson of two more scoring achievements in major college basketball—his third straight national scoring title and an all-time career average record.

With two more regular season games to go, and up to four tournament starts, Robertson has 841 points and a 35.0 average for a comfortable lead over St. Bonaventure's Tom Sitt in the scoring race.

In his career, Robertson has averaged 34.2 and, according to statistics of the NCAA Service Bureau in New York, needs to average only about 10 points a game to break the all-time career average of 28.5 set by Furman's Frank Selvy in three seasons ending in 1954.

On the team level, Ohio State remains first in offense with a 92.3 average, and California in defense with 48.1.
