

Honors Set For General

Brig. Gen. Curtis R. Low, deputy commander of Western Air Defense Force, will be honored Saturday morning at Kingsley Field with a parade, review and F101-B "fly-by."

Officers and airmen will participate in the ceremonies. Lt. Col. Wilson V. Edwards, acting base commander said. A special feature of the parade will be an appearance by the Oregon State College AFROTC drill team, the "Silver Wings."

Six F101-B "Voodoos" will make two low passes over the field, Colonel Edwards said. The formation will be led by Lt. Col. Carl H. Leo, commander of the 32nd Fighter-Interceptor Squadron, and Maj. Raymond G. Nelson, squadron operations officer. The program is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m.

The general will arrive at Kingsley Field this afternoon. He will be the guest of honor at a reception in the Officers Club Friday evening.

Prosecution Raps Finch; Says Testimony Absurd

LOS ANGELES (AP) — In the months since his wife was shot, the state contends, Dr. R. Bernard Finch has concocted a death scene so sugary and synthetic it would be tossed out of a Class-B movie.

It is a drama drawn from soap opera, the prosecution says, a drama the doctor tried to lather with his own tears on the witness stand. But when he was finished, the state maintains, all he had was an unbelievable bubble, a bubble that burst under the bombardment of evidence.

This was the attack of Prosecution on the doctor's testimony at the end of his searing summation. And today, after nearly two months of testimony and argument, the jury was expected to get the case, although it appeared deliberation probably won't start until Saturday.

Manslaughter Sentence Given

YREKA — Frank Smith, 42, transient farm laborer from Tulelake, was sentenced to from one to 10 years in the state penitentiary by Judge James M. Allen of the Siskiyou County Superior Court, February 29.

He had entered a plea of guilty to a charge of voluntary manslaughter in the fatal shooting of Junia James Phipps, 40, also a transient laborer.

Smith, who said his legal name is Fessler Ashley, shot and killed Phipps in a Tulelake cabin the night of January 29 when they became involved in a fracas at a drinking party. Both men were armed.

Smith pleaded guilty on February 17.

'Mark Of The Hawk'

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Potato News Talk Planned For Thursday

TULELAKE — Al Mercker, executive director for the National Potato Council, will discuss pertinent potato news at a meeting of growers of Tulelake, Macdonel and Klamath County. The session will be held at the Sportsman's Hotel here March 10 beginning at 1:30 p.m.

Mercker will talk on the 1959 crop, will discuss guides and outlook for 1960 and will have some last minute information regarding the use of sprout inhibitors and insecticides resulting from action of the Pure Food and Drug Department.

Albert Angus, president, and Francis Pusateri, secretary - manager for the California - Arizona Potato Growers Association, will also be present to discuss functions and objectives of their new two-state organization.

They will be presented by John Cross who has recently been placed on the board of directors as a result of Sam Anderson's resignation. Anderson is a member of the Tulelake Association and recently was nationally recognized for his outstanding work in the potato production industry.

Harold Paulsen and John Adams, chief of the Division for Fruit and Vegetable Standardization, a supervisor of Seed Potato Certification for California, will discuss seed certification grades and regulations and the possibility of setting up a special seed grade for nematode.

Merrill Webb, secretary for the Oregon California Marketing Committee, will conduct an election for grower and alternate member to the committee. Terms of Wesley St. Peter and Wendell Schey have expired.

The association's rail committee will present a late proposal to the Southern Pacific Railroad for reduction of rates from the Klamath Basin to Arizona and New Mexico. This is a counter proposal for maintaining the status quo or rate parity from here as compared with Eastern Oregon and Idaho points.

Sanitarian Assumes Post

The new sanitarian who recently joined the Klamath County Health Department is Willard Ostlund. In his new duties, he works with Noah Squires, formerly of Astoria, who has been with the department for the last six months.

Ostlund formerly lived at Whittier, California, and was an employee of the Santa Fe Railroad for more than 20 years.

In a desire to move out of an area where the population was increasing rapidly, he made a tour of the Pacific Northwest. Here, he resumed his acquaintance with Dr. S. M. Kerron, county public health officer, with whom he had been associated at Vancouver Barracks where Dr. Kerron had a tour of duty as an Army doctor. This led to Ostlund's decision to move to Klamath Falls.

County sanitarians are responsible for sanitary inspection of food establishments, restaurants, motels, hotels, septic tank installations, sewage disposal, nuisances, etc., Dr. Kerron explains.

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
