After graduation, he was employed in Washington, D. C., at the Library of Congress, later served with the Army in the Pacific during World War II...

After leaving government service, business interests and research projects have taken him back to Asia and Europe on several occasions...

Most recently Millegan served as vice president of Scarritt College, a senior college and graduate school of the Methodist Church, located in Nashville, Tennessee.

He has been active as a layman in church work since college days and has attended many national and international church meetings including the ecumenical Oxford Conference on Church and State in Oxford, England, in 1937...
