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Thornton Asks New Felony Law

SALEM (AP) — The Legislature has authority to make drunk driving a felony, punishable by prison sentence, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton told the Legislative Interim Highway Committee today.

Drunk driving now is a misdemeanor, punishable only by a fine and jail sentence.

Thornton said making the crime a felony would be constitutional.

Thornton also said it would be constitutional to pass a law that if a suspected drunk driver refused to take the test for intoxication, his refusal could be used as evidence against him.

Shoots Playmate

PORTLAND (AP) — Victor Scott Graff and Robert A. Peterson, both 4 years old, played with a loaded pistol in the Graff home in Portland Sunday.

Kings Canyon, a national park in California since 1940, is famed for its giant sequoia trees.



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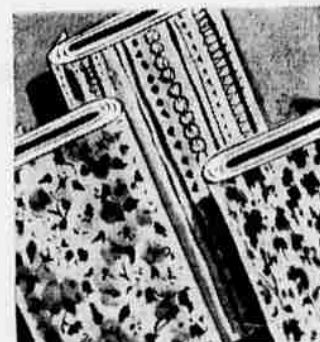
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
