Olympic Ace Proves Worth

NEW YORK (AP)—Any myths about the goal-tending abilities of Olympic star Jack McCartan are rapidly being dispelled and some expert opinions are taking their place.

McCartan was goalie on Uncle Sam's Olympic champion hockey team and a week later was in the nets for the New York Rangers in the National Hockey League. He won his first game last Sunday, 3-1 over Detroit.

"I like the way he handles himself," goalie Glenn Hall of the Chicago Black Hawks said Wednesday night after McCartan held the Hawks to a 1-1 tie in his second game with the Rangers.

"I particularly like the way he uses his right skate to block shots. That shows some class," Hall added.

McCartan, 24 and a St. Paul, Minn., native, is on leave from the Army to try his hand at big-time hockey.

Pelican Spirits High; Matmen Seek Wins

Klamath Union's hopes for 1960 Oregon prep wrestling championships rode to Corvallis this morning in the persons of nine high spirited Pelican varsity grapplers who will compete with the cream of the state's crop in the annual A-1 wrestling tournament in progress Friday and Saturday on the Oregon State College mats.

Led by coaches Delance Duncan and Jack Peterson, the squad included Milo Crumrine, Gary Head, Dan Ross, Trenton Douglas, Dave Gonzales, Larry Wishart, Art Mills, Joe Cox and Billy O'Neil.

The team, together with the Pelican varsity basketball club which is due at the state cage tourney next week in Eugene, was honored at a sendoff banquet sponsored by the Pelican Booster Club Wednesday night in the Chuck Wagon.

Also attending the dinner were the fathers of most of the members of each squad.

Duncan and Dean White, head basketball coach, introduced each player who in turn presented his father.

Called upon for comment were captain Bob Lewis of the cage squad, and co-captain Trenton Douglas of the wrestlers.

Said Lewis, "The ball team has a bet with the wrestlers that we will finish ahead of them. We sincerely hope they come out number one and still lose a bet. Our best wishes go with them."

Douglas commented that although the two sports differ, in that the wrestling is done on an individual basis, they were much alike in the team spirit engendered and, in turn, wished the basketball team the best of luck.

Santa Anita Widens Gate

ARCADIA, Calif. (AP)—Santa Anita had to "stretch" the starting gate today for the \$100,000-added San Juan Capistrano Handicap, final feature of the 35-day winter meeting.

A field of 18 runners was entered. The distance is about a mile and three-quarters.

An auxiliary section was hatched on to the main gate to handle the overflow.

The largest previous field for the grass run was 16 in 1954.

The handicap offered a possible net prize of \$74,300 to the winner if all 18 get to the post.

The betting favorite was Americano, winner of two out of three races in Florida, including the Hialeah Turf Cup. His rider was Willie Hartack.

Chief challengers appeared to be Whodunit and American Comet.

Skill, Not KO Power Feature GG Fights

CHICAGO (AP)—Chicago's Golden Gloves squad will take boxing skill rather than kayo power against New York's best amateurs in the intercity bouts in Madison Square Garden March 21.

There was not a knockout Wednesday night in the finals of the 33rd Tournament of Champions witnessed by 11,159 in Chicago Stadium and viewed, in part, by a national television audience.

However, paced by new heavyweight champion Cassius Clay, a real fancy dan, and two perpetual-motion little scrappers in Greek twins, Pete and Nick Spanakos, the Chicago squad is clever and quick.

Clay, 18, of Louisville, Ky., used a superb footwork and quick hands to dethrone defending champion Jimmy Jones, 19, of Gary, Ind.

The Spanakos brothers attend the College of Idaho and represented Hollywood, Calif.

Pete won the 118-pound crown over Darrell Shavanas, 17, Denver. Brother Nick outboxed Tom O'Shea, Chicago, for the 126-pound title.

Davis defeated Cincinnati's Billy Joiner for the 175-pound championship.

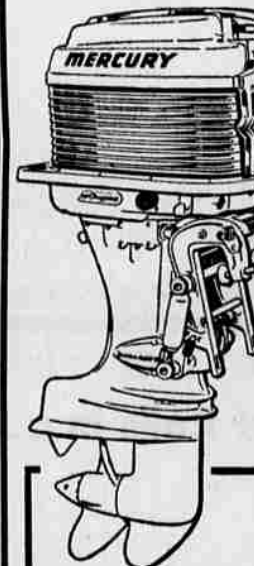
Brian O'Shea, a brother of Tom, outpointed Reggie Davis of Fort Worth for the lightweight title.

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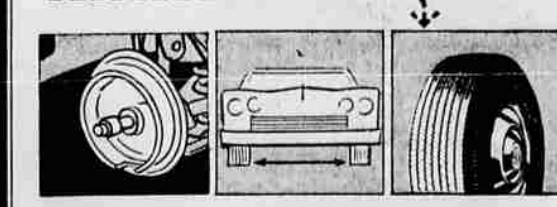


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
