## Boat Owners Must Have Licenses

This spring, for the first time, boats operating on Oregon lakes and rivers must have numbers, licenses, and title papers. The system installed by the new State Marine Board is similar to requirements for automobiles.

Application blanks for numbers, licenses, and titles may be obtained from the sheriff's office, Department of Motor Vehicles office, and most boat dealers. Here are the basic requirements:

**Numbers**—Any boat powered by motors of 10 h.p. or more must have a number, regardless of length. Deputy Sheriff Lou Bogart said numbers effective here will begin with "OR" for Oregon and end with "KL" for Klamath County.

**License**—Any boat powered by motors of 10 h.p. or more must have a license, regardless of length. Additionally, any boat 12 feet or longer must have a license. However, if it is 12 feet or longer, it must have a license and title.

**Title**—Any boat requiring a license must have title papers. The charge for a number is \$5, and the number is valid for three years. Titles cost \$2. License fees vary from \$3 for boats up to 16 feet long to \$5 plus \$1 per additional foot for boats 20 feet and longer.

Thus the total cost for a power boat up to 16 feet long is \$10, and for a power boat from 16 to 20 feet long is \$12 the first year.

No numbers are required for sailboats unless they have an auxiliary motor of 10 h.p. or more.

The new law eliminates numbers issued by the Coast Guard for boats used on Oregon's coast. Those now must be numbered and licensed by the State Marine Board.
